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Important Notice

This Information Memorandum replaces in its entirety the Information Memorandum dated 29 June 2021.

Introduction

This Information Memorandum relates to a debt issuance programme (“**Programme**”) established by OP Corporate Bank plc (“**Issuer**”), a Finnish limited liability company, under which medium term notes and other debt securities (collectively referred to as “**Notes**”) may, from time to time, be issued up to the Programme Amount (as defined in the section entitled “*Summary of the Programme*” below).

Terms used in this Information Memorandum but not otherwise defined have the meaning given to them in the Conditions (as defined below).

*The Issuer is neither a bank nor an authorised deposit-taking institution which is authorised under the Banking Act 1959 of Australia (“**Banking Act**”) nor is it supervised by the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority. The Notes are not obligations of any government and, in particular, are not guaranteed by the Commonwealth of Australia. The depositor protection provisions in Division 2 of Part II of the Banking Act do not apply to the Issuer. No Notes shall be “protected accounts” or “deposit liabilities” within the meaning of the Banking Act and an investment in any Notes will not be covered by the depositor protection provisions in section 13A of the Banking Act and will not be covered by the Australian Government’s bank deposit guarantee (also commonly referred to as the Financial Claims Scheme). Notes that are offered for issue or sale or transferred in, or into, Australia are offered only in circumstances that would not require disclosure to investors under Part 6D.2 or Chapter 7 of the Corporations Act 2001 of Australia (“**Corporations Act**”) and must only be issued and transferred in compliance with the terms of the exemption from compliance with section 66 of the Banking Act that is available to the Issuer (including that such Notes must be issued or transferred in, or into, Australia in parcels of not less than A\$500,000 in aggregate principal amount).*

Issuer’s responsibility

This Information Memorandum has been prepared by, and issued with the authority of, the Issuer.

The Issuer accepts responsibility for the information contained in this Information Memorandum other than information provided by the Arranger, the Dealers and the Agents (each as defined in the section entitled “*Summary of the Programme*” below) (each a “**Programme Participant**”, and together, the “**Programme Participants**”) in relation to their respective descriptions in the sections entitled “*Summary of the Programme*” and “*Directory*” below.

Place of issuance

Subject to applicable laws and directives, the Issuer may issue Notes under the Programme in any country including Australia and countries in Europe and Asia but not in the United States of America unless such Notes are registered under the United States Securities Act of 1933 (as amended) (“**Securities Act**”) or an exemption from the registration requirements under the Securities Act is available.

Terms and conditions of issue

Notes will be issued in series (each a “**Series**”). Each Series may comprise one or more tranches (each a “**Tranche**”) having one or more issue dates and on conditions that are otherwise identical (other than, to the extent relevant, in respect of the issue price and the amount and date of the first payment of interest).

Each issue of Notes will be made pursuant to such documentation as the Issuer may determine. A pricing supplement and/or another supplement to this Information Memorandum (each a “**Pricing Supplement**”) will be issued for each Tranche or Series of Notes. A Pricing Supplement will contain details of the initial aggregate principal amount, issue price, issue date, maturity date, details of interest

(if any) payable together with any other terms and conditions not set out in this Information Memorandum that may be applicable to that Tranche or Series of Notes. The terms and conditions (“**Conditions**”) applicable to the Notes are included in this Information Memorandum and may be supplemented, amended, modified or replaced by the Pricing Supplement applicable to those Notes.

The Issuer may also publish a supplement to this Information Memorandum (or additional Information Memoranda) which describes the issue of Notes (or particular classes of Notes) not otherwise described in this Information Memorandum. A Pricing Supplement or other supplement to this Information Memorandum may also supplement, amend, modify or replace any statement or information set out in a Pricing Supplement or incorporated by reference in this Information Memorandum or a supplement to this Information Memorandum.

SRM Regulation, EU Bank Resolution and Recovery Directive

OP Financial Group (as defined in the section entitled “*Description of the Issuer*” below) is subject to Regulation (EU) No. 806/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 15 July 2014 establishing uniform rules and a uniform procedure for the resolution of credit institutions and certain investment firms in the framework of a Single Resolution Mechanism and a Single Resolution Fund (the “**SRM Regulation**”). Directive 2014/59/EU establishing a framework for the recovery and resolution of credit institutions and investment firms (the “**BRRD**”) is also partly applicable. The BRRD was transposed into Finnish law mainly by the Finnish Act on the Resolution of Credit Institutions and Investment Firms (in Finnish: *Laki luottolaitosten ja sijoituspalveluyritysten kriisinratkaisusta* 1194/2014), as amended (the “**Resolution Act**”) and the Finnish Act on the Financial Stability Authority (in Finnish: *Laki rahoitusvakausviranomaisesta* 1195/2014), as amended (the “**Financial Stability Authority Act**”). The ranking of claims in resolution, as well as in bankruptcy, is set out in Section 4a of Chapter 1 of the Finnish Act on Credit Institutions (in Finnish: *Laki luottolaitostoiminnasta*, 610/2014), as amended or superseded (the “**Credit Institutions Act**”), which provides exceptions to the Act on the Order of Payment of Creditors (in Finnish: *Laki velkojien maksunsaantijärjestyksestä*, 1578/1992), as amended (the “**Priority Act**”). Selling restrictions and no disclosure

The distribution and use of this Information Memorandum, including any Pricing Supplement, advertisement or other offering material, and the offer or sale of Notes may be restricted by law or directive in certain jurisdictions and intending purchasers and other investors should inform themselves about them and observe any such restrictions.

In particular:

- this Information Memorandum is not a prospectus or other disclosure document for the purposes of the Corporations Act. Neither this Information Memorandum nor any other disclosure document in relation to the Notes has been, or will be, lodged with the Australian Securities and Investments Commission (“**ASIC**”); and
- no action has been taken by the Issuer or any Programme Participant Party which would permit a public offering of the Notes or distribution of this Information Memorandum or any such document in any jurisdiction where action for that purpose is required (including circumstances that would require disclosure under Parts 6D.2 or 7.9 of the Corporations Act).

For a description of certain restrictions on offers, sales and deliveries of the Notes, and on distribution of this Information Memorandum, any Pricing Supplement or other offering material relating to the Notes, see the section entitled “*Selling Restrictions*” below.

A person may not (directly or indirectly) offer for subscription or purchase or issue an invitation to subscribe for or buy Notes, nor distribute or publish this Information Memorandum or any other offering material or advertisement relating to the Notes except if the offer or invitation, or distribution or publication, complies with all applicable laws and directives.

No registration in the United States

The Notes have not been, and will not be, registered under the Securities Act. The Notes may not be offered, sold, delivered or transferred, at any time, within the United States of America, its territories or possessions or to, or for the account or benefit of, U.S. persons (as defined in Regulation S under the Securities Act (“**Regulation S**”)) except in a transaction exempt from, or not subject to, the registration requirements of the Securities Act.

Agency and distribution arrangements

Each Programme Participant is acting solely as an arm’s length contractual counterparty and not as an adviser or fiduciary to the Issuer or any prospective purchaser of the Notes. Furthermore, neither the receipt of this Information Memorandum or any other material relating to the Programme or the issue of any Notes by any person nor any other matter shall be deemed to create or give rise to an advisory or fiduciary duty (or any other duty) or relationship between the Programme Participant and that person (including, without limitation, in respect of the preparation and due execution of the documents in connection with the Programme or any Notes and the power, capacity or authorisation of any other party to enter into and execute such documents).

The Programme Participant Parties are involved in a wide range of financial services and businesses including securities trading and brokerage activities and providing commercial and investment banking, investment management, corporate finance, credit and derivative, trading and research products and services, out of which conflicting interests or duties may arise. In the ordinary course of these activities, the Programme Participant Parties or the funds which they manage or advise or the funds within which they may have a direct or indirect interest, may from time to time have long or short positions in, or buy and sell (on a principal basis or otherwise), or have pecuniary or other interests in, or act as a market maker in, the Notes or securities, derivatives, commodities, futures or options identical or related to the Notes and may also have interests pursuant to other arrangements and may receive fees, brokerage, commissions and other compensation and may act as a principal in dealing in any Notes.

The Issuer has agreed to pay fees to the Agents for undertaking their respective roles and reimburse them for certain of their expenses incurred in connection with the Programme and the offer and sale of Notes.

The Issuer may also pay any Dealer or any other person a fee in respect of the Notes subscribed by it, may agree to reimburse the Arranger and/or the Dealers for certain expenses incurred in connection with this Programme and may indemnify the Dealers against certain liabilities in connection with the offer and sale of Notes.

References to credit ratings

There are references to credit ratings in this Information Memorandum. A credit rating is not a recommendation to buy, sell or hold securities and may be subject to revision, suspension or withdrawal at any time by the relevant assigning organisation. Each credit rating should be evaluated independently of any other credit rating.

Credit ratings are for distribution only to a person (a) who is not a “retail client” within the meaning of section 761G of the Corporations Act and is also a person in respect of whom disclosure is not required under Parts 6D.2 or 7.9 of the Corporations Act, and (b) who is otherwise permitted to receive credit ratings in accordance with applicable law in any jurisdiction in which the person may be located. Anyone who is not such a person is not entitled to receive this Information Memorandum and anyone who receives this Information Memorandum must not distribute it to any person who is not entitled to receive it.

Currencies

In this Information Memorandum, references to “**A\$**” or “**Australian dollars**” are to the lawful currency of the Commonwealth of Australia and references to “**€**”, “**Euro**”, “**EUR**” or “**euro**” are to the lawful currency of the member states of the European Union that have adopted the single currency in accordance with the Treaty establishing the European Community, as amended from time to time.

Currency of information

The information contained in this Information Memorandum is prepared as of its Preparation Date. Neither the delivery of this Information Memorandum nor any offer, issue or sale made in connection with this Information Memorandum at any time implies that the information contained in it is correct, that any other information supplied in connection with the Programme or the issue of Notes is correct or that there has not been any change (adverse or otherwise) in the financial conditions or affairs of the Issuer at any time subsequent to the Preparation Date. In particular, the Issuer is not under any obligation to any person to update this Information Memorandum at any time after an issue of Notes.

In this Information Memorandum, “**Preparation Date**” means, in relation to:

Any person subsequently offering, selling or recommending the Notes (a “**distributor**”) should take into consideration the target market assessment; however, a distributor subject to MiFID II and/or the FCA Handbook Product Intervention and Product Governance Sourcebook (the “**UK MiFIR Product Governance Rules**”), as applicable, is responsible for undertaking its own target market assessment in respect of the Notes (by either adopting or refining the target market assessment) and determining appropriate distribution channels.

A determination will be made in relation to each issue of Notes about whether, for the purpose of the MiFID Product Governance rules under EU Delegated Directive 2017/593 (as amended) (the “**MiFID Product Governance Rules**”) and/or the UK MiFIR Product Governance Rules, as applicable, any Dealer subscribing for any Notes is a manufacturer in respect of such Notes, but otherwise neither the Arranger nor the Dealers nor any of their respective affiliates will be a manufacturer for the purpose of the MiFID Product Governance Rules and/or the UK MiFIR Product Governance Rules, as applicable.

Status and ranking: The Notes may be either Senior Preferred Notes or Senior Non-Preferred Notes, in each case as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement.

Senior Preferred Notes

The Senior Preferred Notes constitute unsubordinated and unsecured obligations of the Issuer and rank *pari passu* without any preference among themselves and at least *pari passu* with all other present or future unsecured and unsubordinated indebtedness of the Issuer, subject to statutorily preferred exceptions.

Senior Non-Preferred Notes

The Senior Non-Preferred Notes constitute direct and unsecured obligations of the Issuer and rank and will rank *pari passu* without any preference among themselves.

In the event of the winding-up, insolvency or bankruptcy of the Issuer, the rights and claims (if any) of holders of any Senior Non-Preferred Notes to payments of the principal amount and any other amounts in respect of the Senior Non-Preferred Notes (including any accrued but unpaid interest amount, damages or other payments awarded for breach of any obligations under the Conditions, if any are payable) shall:

- (a) be subordinated to the claims of all depositors and other unsecured and unsubordinated creditors of the Issuer (including Senior Preferred Notes), provided that in each case such claims are not by mandatory provisions of law ranked, or by their terms expressed to rank, *pari passu* with or subordinated to the claims of holders of Senior Non-Preferred Notes;
- (b) rank at least *pari passu* with the claims of all other creditors of the Issuer which in each case by law rank, or by their terms are expressed to rank, *pari passu* with the claims of holders of Senior Non-Preferred Notes; and
- (c) rank senior to any Junior Securities of the Issuer.

Set-Off:	Noteholders shall not be entitled to exercise any right of set-off or netting against moneys owed by the Issuer in respect of such Notes.

Description of the Issuer

OP Corporate Bank plc (in Finnish: *OP Yrityspankki Oyj*, formerly known as Pohjola Bank plc) was established for an indefinite period on 14 May 1902 in Helsinki with the name *Osuuskassojen Keskuslainarahasto-Osakeyhtiö*. Pohjola Bank plc was renamed OP Corporate Bank plc on 4 April 2016. The Issuer's registration number in the Finnish Patent and Registration Office is 0199920-7 and its domicile is in Helsinki, therefore Finnish legislation applies to the Issuer. The Issuer's accounting period is one calendar year. The Issuer's A shares were delisted from the Official List of Nasdaq Helsinki Ltd. on 30 September 2014 and the A Shares and K Shares were combined to form a single series of shares as of 28 November 2014. The Issuer's registered address is OP Corporate Bank plc, Gebhardinaukio 1, FI-00510 Helsinki, Finland and its telephone number is +358 10 252 010.

As at the date of this Information Memorandum, the Issuer is a wholly owned subsidiary of OP Cooperative (formerly known as OP-Pohjola Group Central Cooperative). See "*The Issuer as a Part of OP Financial Group*" below.

The Issuer is the central financing institution of the Member Cooperative Banks (as defined below) and as a commercial bank it engages in the business operations set forth in the Finnish Act on Credit Institutions (in Finnish: *Laki luottolaitostoiminnasta*, 610/2014), as amended (the "**Credit Institutions Act**"). The special purpose of the Issuer is to promote, as the central financing institution of OP Financial Group (as defined below), the activities of the Member Cooperative Banks and other institutions belonging to OP Financial Group.

The Issuer is a credit institution authorised under the Credit Institutions Act and under public supervision. The Issuer is subject to prudential supervision by the European Central Bank (the "**ECB**"). The Issuer is also supervised by OP Cooperative as stated in the Act on Amalgamations of Deposit Banks (in Finnish: *Laki talletuspankkien yhteenliittymästä*, 599/2010), as amended (the "**Amalgamations Act**"). The Issuer is also authorised to provide investment services pursuant to Chapter 5, Section 2 of the Credit Institutions Act and Chapter 1, Section 15 of the Finnish Act on Investment Services (in Finnish: *Sijoituspalvelulaki*, 747/2012), as amended (the "**Investment Services Act**"). Apart from these businesses, the Issuer is the central financing institution of the Member Cooperative Banks and is responsible for OP Financial Group's liquidity management and international affairs. The Issuer is engaged in corporate banking and central bank business. The Issuer focuses on serving customers both at home and abroad. Through its alliances, the Issuer is able to deliver abroad banking services to its customers in a cost-effective and locally oriented way. The Issuer has branches in Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania.

The Issuer's three business segments are (i) Corporate Banking and Capital Markets, (ii) Asset and Sales Finance Services and Payment Transfers, and (iii) Baltics. Non-business operations are presented in the Group Functions segment.

The Corporate Banking and Capital Markets business segment provides corporate and institutional customers with financing and liquidity management services. The services range from the arrangement of debt issues, equity, foreign exchange, bond, money market and derivative products and structured investment products to investment research. In addition to its own clients, the segment also provides capital market products and services to corporate and personal clients through Member Cooperative Banks.

The Asset and Sales Finance Services and Payment Transfers business segment provides consumers and companies with customer financing services, payment and liquidity management services, financing services for foreign trade and leasing and factoring services.

With its local expertise, the Baltics business segment provides corporate and institutional customers with financing and liquidity management services and financing services for foreign trade in the Baltics.

Functions supporting OP Financial Group, such as Group Treasury, are centralised within the Group Functions non-business segment. Group Treasury is responsible for the management of the funding and liquidity of Affiliated Credit Institutions (as defined in the section entitled "*Description of OP Financial Group and OP Cooperative*" below) and OP Cooperative and its subsidiaries (together the "**Central**

Cooperative Consolidated). It also oversees OP Financial Group's wholesale funding together with OP Mortgage Bank. In addition, income, expenses, investments and capital which have not been allocated to the business segments are reported under the Group Functions non-business segment.

The Issuer as a Part of OP Financial Group

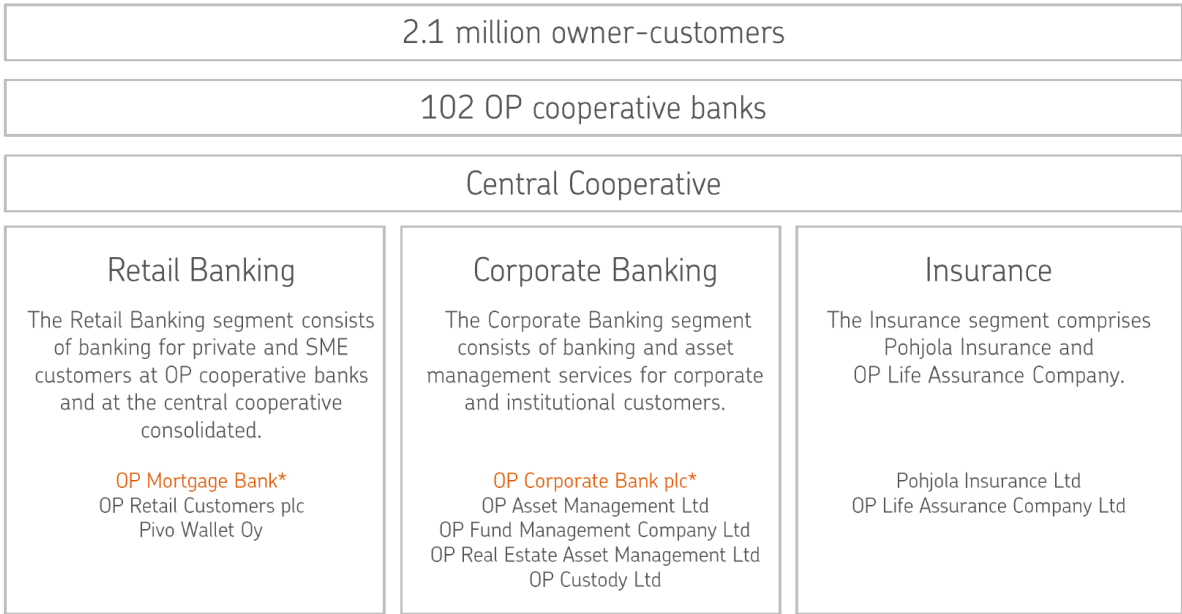
The Issuer is a fully owned subsidiary of OP Cooperative (in Finnish: *OP Osuuskunta*, formerly known as OP-Pohjola Group Central Cooperative).

OP Financial Group began its operations in its current form without the non-life insurance business on 1 July 1997. In accordance with applicable law, **“OP Financial Group”** consists of OP Cooperative, its financial and non-financial subsidiaries and the member cooperative banks of OP Financial Group (the **“Member Cooperative Banks”**).

The Issuer, together with OP Cooperative and its financial subsidiaries and the Member Cooperative Banks, constitute an amalgamation of deposit banks as regulated by the Amalgamations Act and Article 10 of Regulation (EU) No 575/2013 (as amended, the **“CRR”**) (**“OP Amalgamation”**) (see *“Description of OP Financial Group and the OP Cooperative”* below).

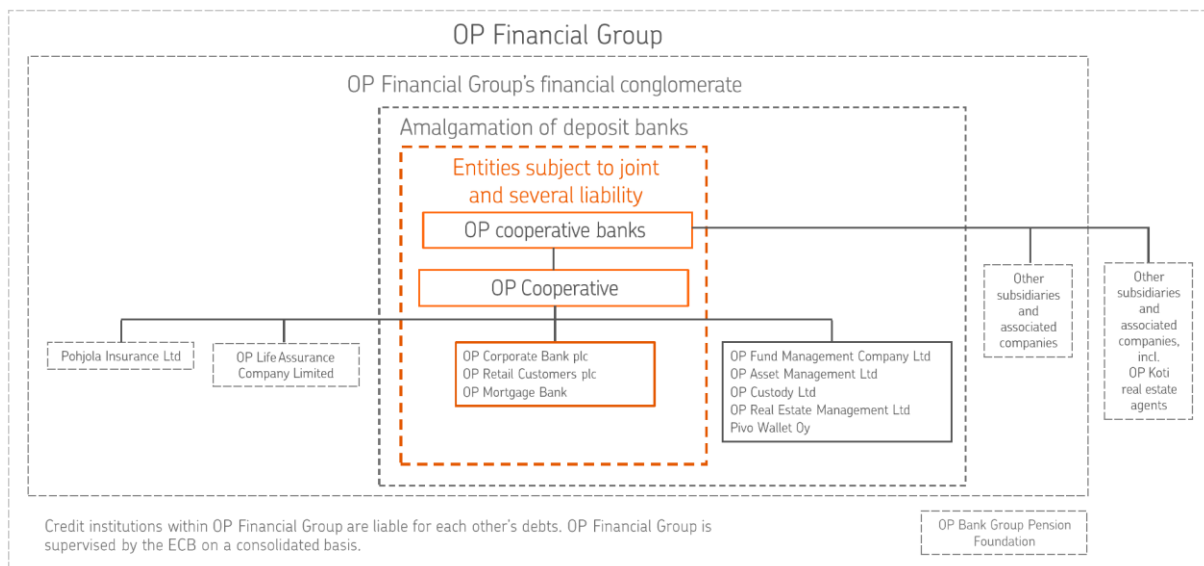
The Company Structure of OP Financial Group and the Issuer (as at 31 December 2023).

Description of OP Financial Group and OP Cooperative

Legal structure of OP Financial Group

OP Financial Group is a Finnish cooperative financial services group that consists of OP Cooperative, its subsidiaries and independent local and regional Member Cooperative Banks.

OP Cooperative, its credit institution subsidiaries and the Member Cooperative Banks together constitute an amalgamation of deposit banks (together, “**OP Amalgamation**”) within the meaning of the Amalgamations Act. OP Cooperative is the central institution and its credit institution subsidiaries and the Member Cooperative Banks (together, “**Affiliated Credit Institutions**”) are credit institutions affiliated to the central institution within the meaning of Article 10 of the CRR.

Credit institutions, whose bylaws comply with the requirements of the Amalgamations Act and have been approved by OP Cooperative, can be accepted as members of OP Cooperative. New members are accepted by the Supervisory Council of OP Cooperative. An Affiliated Credit Institution has the right to withdraw from OP Amalgamation. An Affiliated Credit Institution can also be expelled from OP Amalgamation in accordance with the Act on Cooperatives (in Finnish: *Osuuskuntalaki*, 421/2013), as amended (the “**Cooperatives Act**”) or if it has neglected its obligations towards OP Amalgamation as specified in the bylaws of OP Cooperative.

As of 31 December 2023, the Affiliated Credit Institutions of OP Cooperative consist of:

- (i) the credit institution subsidiaries of OP Cooperative comprising the Issuer which is responsible for the wholesale funding of OP Financial Group and other treasury activities in addition to the corporate lending business of OP Financial Group; OP Retail Customers plc, which administers the credit cards issued by OP Financial Group; and OP Mortgage Bank, which issues covered bonds backed by the residential loan portfolios of the Affiliated Credit Institutions; and
- (ii) 102 Member Cooperative Banks which carry out retail banking business and which are members of OP Cooperative, thus exercising decision-making powers at the highest administrative level of OP Financial Group.

In addition to OP Cooperative and the Affiliated Credit institutions, which are covered by the solidarity mechanism, OP Amalgamation includes, as subsidiaries of OP Cooperative, an investment firm (OP Asset Management Ltd), a fund management company (OP Fund Management Company Ltd), a custody company (OP Custody Ltd), an ancillary services undertaking (Pivo Wallet Oy) and an alternative fund manager (OP Real Estate Asset Management Company Ltd).

Apart from OP Amalgamation, OP Financial Group also includes, as subsidiaries of OP Cooperative, a life insurance company (OP Life Assurance Company Ltd), a non-life insurance company (Pohjola Insurance Ltd) and some minor companies as well as the real estate agencies owned jointly by Member Cooperative Banks under the brand name OP Koti.

OP Amalgamation and the insurance and financial subsidiaries of OP Cooperative together constitute a bank-dominated financial conglomerate within the meaning of the Directive (2002/87/EC) and the Finnish Act on the Supervision of Financial and Insurance Conglomerates (in Finnish: *Laki rahoitus- ja vakuutusryhmittymien valvonnasta*, 699/2004), as amended. The ECB has waived, until further notice, the application of this Act to the sub-group constituted by OP Cooperative and its subsidiaries.

OP Cooperative is under a statutory obligation to:

- (i) supervise the Affiliated Credit Institutions;
- (ii) issue instructions to them on risk management, good corporate governance and internal controls to secure liquidity and capital adequacy of OP Amalgamation; and

- (iii) issue instructions on compliance with standardised accounting policies in the preparation of the consolidated financial statements.

In the manner specified in its bylaws, OP Cooperative may also confirm general principles to be followed by the Affiliated Credit Institutions in their operations relevant to OP Amalgamation. The Affiliated Credit Institutions are, among other things, bound by OP Financial Group's risk appetite statement, risk appetite framework and detailed risk policies as confirmed by OP Cooperative's Board of Directors.

OP Cooperative supervises the Affiliated Credit Institutions in order to ensure that they comply with the instructions issued and principles confirmed by OP Cooperative, notably that they do not, in the course of their operations, take any risk of such magnitude that poses a substantial risk to the consolidated financial position of OP Amalgamation. The Affiliated Credit Institutions are accountable to OP Cooperative in accordance with the principles of joint and several liability confirmed by OP Cooperative. Based on these principles, OP Cooperative can take measures *vis-à-vis* the Affiliated Credit Institutions for failing to comply with the instructions and principles confirmed by OP Cooperative. These measures range from increased monitoring to expelling an Affiliated Credit Institution from OP Amalgamation.

OP Cooperative is responsible for providing centralised services to the Affiliated Credit Institutions, including strategic and capital planning, liquidity and funding, risk management, accounting, financial and supervisory reporting, legal services, information and communications technology (including the design and maintenance of the digital distribution channels) service design, service range, and marketing. The Affiliated Credit Institutions, while operationally dependent on the centralised services provided by OP Cooperative, are independent in maintaining their capital base and deciding on the distribution of their profits (within the limits of OP Financial Group's capital plan) as well as in respect of their customer selection and individual business decisions.

OP Financial Group does not form a corporate group as defined in the Finnish Accounting Act (in Finnish: *Kirjanpitolaki*, 1336/1997), as amended, or a consolidation group as defined in the Credit Institutions Act. Under Finnish laws on bank supervision, OP Financial Group is monitored on a consolidated basis.

OP Cooperative was entered into the trade register maintained by the Finnish Patent and Registration Office on 23 May 1997. OP Cooperative's business identity code is 0242522-1. OP Cooperative's registered address is OP Cooperative, Gebhardinaukio 1, FI-00510 Helsinki, Finland and its telephone number is +358 10 252 010. OP Financial Group's financial period is the calendar year.

Solidarity mechanism in OP Amalgamation

General principles

The mutual solidarity mechanism applied within OP Amalgamation is laid down in the Amalgamations Act. OP Cooperative as the central institution is responsible for the implementation of the solidarity mechanism (such as the calculation of contributions from the Affiliated Credit Institutions and the collection of the contributions as well as forwarding the contributions to the Affiliated Credit Institution being supported) and it has the ultimate liability for the obligations of the Affiliated Credit Institutions. Each Affiliated Credit Institution has right of recourse against OP Cooperative for the amount of the contribution it has made to OP Cooperative under the solidarity mechanism. OP Cooperative has, in turn, a right of recourse against each supported Affiliated Credit Institution for the amount paid to it by OP Cooperative.

The solidarity mechanism consists of the following elements:

- (a) mutual capital support to ensure the capital adequacy of an Affiliated Credit Institution which does not meet its statutory capital requirements;
- (b) joint and several liability between the Affiliated Credit Institutions to ensure the liquidity of an Affiliated Credit Institution that cannot meet its due obligations; and
- (c) unlimited refinancing liability of the Affiliated Credit Institutions in the insolvency of OP Cooperative in accordance with the Cooperatives Act.

An Affiliated Credit Institution will remain liable for its obligations under the solidarity mechanism for the first five years after withdrawal or expulsion from OP Amalgamation.

Mutual capital support

Each Affiliated Credit Institution has the obligation to lend to OP Cooperative an annual amount of up to 0.5% of its balance sheet total, to be used by OP Cooperative to recapitalise an Affiliated Credit Institution that fails to meet its statutory capital requirements.

Joint and several liability

A creditor who has not received payment for an overdue claim from an Affiliated Credit Institution in respect of the principal amount of a debt (or any interest thereon) may demand payment from OP Cooperative. An Affiliated Credit Institution may not be declared bankrupt upon a creditor's petition before the creditor has demanded the repayment of the principal debt from OP Cooperative.

The other Affiliated Credit Institutions have a statutory obligation to lend OP Cooperative the amount it has paid on behalf of an Affiliated Credit Institution that has failed to meet its payment obligation to creditors. The proportional share of each Affiliated Credit Institution is calculated on the basis of the share of its balance sheet total of the aggregate balance sheet total of all Affiliated Credit Institutions.

OP Corporate Bank is, on a centralised basis, responsible for OP Financial Group's liquidity reserve and the liquidity of OP Cooperative and the Affiliated Credit Institutions in all situations. As the joint liability is already in place through the single liquidity pool within OP Amalgamation, the procedural provisions laid down in the Amalgamations Act need not be applied in practice.

Notwithstanding the joint responsibility between the Affiliated Credit Institutions, there is no guarantee in place which directly ensures the repayment of Notes issued under this Programme. The payment obligations under the Notes are solely obligations of the Issuer and are not obligations of, and are not guaranteed by, OP Cooperative and/or any Affiliated Credit Institution (other than the Issuer itself).

Refinancing liability on OP Cooperative's default

The Member Cooperative Banks, as members of OP Cooperative, have unlimited refinancing liability in case of OP Cooperative's liquidation or bankruptcy, in accordance with Chapter 14 of the Cooperatives Act. The liability of each Member Cooperative Bank is determined on the basis of its balance sheet total assets.

The Business Activity Structure of OP Financial Group and the Issuer

OP Cooperative acts as the entire OP Financial Group's strategic owner institution and as a central institution in charge of Group control, Group steering and supervision.

The Central Cooperative Consolidated comprises OP Cooperative and its subsidiaries.

OP Cooperative's Other Subsidiaries

Pohjola Insurance Ltd (in Finnish: *Pohjola Vakuutus Oy*) is a non-life insurance company. The range of non-life insurance products it offers includes non-life policies for corporate and private customers.

OP Life Assurance Company Ltd (in Finnish: *OP-Henkivakuutus Oy*) runs OP Financial Group's life and pension insurance operations in a centralised manner. It also sees to their development. OP Life Assurance Company Ltd.'s portfolio includes life, pension, investment and term insurance services.

OP Asset Management Ltd (in Finnish: *OP Varainhoito Oy*) offers a broad range of comprehensive asset management services, discretionary portfolio management and consultative asset management services for Finnish institutions and wealthy private individuals and families.

OP Fund Management Company Ltd. (in Finnish: *OP-Rahastoyhtiö Oy*) manages OP Financial Group's mutual funds. It makes use of the service network of the Member Cooperative Banks as well as OP Financial Group's online services in selling fund units.

OP Mortgage Bank (in Finnish: *OP-Asuntoluottopankki Oy*) serves as the mortgage bank of OP Financial Group and its purpose is to issue covered bonds backed by mortgage collateral in accordance with the Finnish Act on Mortgage Credit Banks and Covered Bonds (in Finnish: *Laki kiinnitysluottopankeista ja katetuista joukkolainoista*, 151/2022), as amended. OP Mortgage Bank transfers collateral of housing loans originated by OP Member Cooperative Banks to its cover pool via an intermediary loan process.

OP Retail Customers plc (in Finnish: *OP Vähittäisasiakkaat Oy*) provides unsecured consumer loans to the Member Cooperative Banks' private customers.

Two former Member Cooperative Banks, Itä-Uudenmaan Osuuspankki and Uudenmaan Osuuspankki, merged into Helsinki Area Cooperative Bank (which was consequently renamed to Uudenmaan Osuuspankki) on 31 July 2022. Following the merger, Uudenmaan Osuuspankki is no longer part of Central Cooperative Consolidated.

Other Institutions

OP Bank Group Pension Foundation handles the supplementary pension security for persons covered by it.

Owner-membership

The cooperative movement is OP Financial Group's ideological foundation and the starting point for its strategic objectives. As at 31 December 2023, OP Financial Group had a total of 2.1 million owner-customers (a total of 2.1 million customers as at 31 December 2022). Owner-customers are customers who use the services of a Member Cooperative Bank and are also members of the said Member Cooperative Bank. It follows naturally from this combination of ownership and customership that the benefit and added value of each Member Cooperative Bank's operations are channelled, via the customer relationship, to owner-customers and customers. The fundamental objective of cooperative operations is thus not to maximise profits for the owners but to provide, as competitively as possible, the services which the cooperative's owner-customers and customers need.

Owner-membership is a distinctive feature of the Member Cooperative Bank customer relationship. Owner-membership offers a chance to participate in the relevant Member Cooperative Bank's administration and decision-making. In addition, owner-membership brings benefits through the focusing of one's banking matters with a Member Cooperative Bank. The Member Cooperative Banks have the corporate form of a cooperative, in which the basic values underlying decision-making include the one member, one vote principle. Within the Member Cooperative Banks, the highest decision-making body is the cooperative meeting or assembly, which elects a Supervisory Board for the Member Cooperative Bank. The Supervisory Board elects an Executive Board for the Member Cooperative Bank. A person can become an owner-customer of a Member Cooperative Bank by paying a cooperative contribution and applying for membership. The owner-customers, who are made up primarily of private individuals, elect from amongst their number the administrative staff of their own bank. The Member Cooperative Banks' basic capital consists of the cooperative capital and any supplementary cooperative capital. Contributions made by Member Cooperative Banks' owner-customers to the banks' profit shares and ordinary cooperative capital totalled EUR 3.6 billion on 31 December 2023 (unaudited). A profit share is an owner-customer's voluntary capital contribution to the Member Cooperative Bank's equity.

Member Cooperative Banks

The Member Cooperative Banks are independent, local deposit banks that are engaged in retail banking. In their area of operations, they offer modern and competitive banking services to household customers, small and medium-sized business customers, agricultural and forestry customers and to public sector entities.

EU Bank Resolution and Recovery Directive

SRM Regulation, Recovery and Resolution Directive and Finnish implementation

OP Financial Group is subject to the SRM Regulation. The BRRD is also partly applicable. The BRRD was transposed into Finnish law mainly by the Resolution Act and the Financial Stability Authority Act. The ranking of claims in resolution, as well as in bankruptcy, is set out in Section 4a of Chapter 1 of the Credit Institutions Act, which provides exceptions to the Finnish Priority Act.

The SRM Regulation applies to entities covered by the EU's Single Supervisory Mechanism (i.e., banks and banking groups subject to direct prudential supervision by the ECB). According to the selection criteria of the ECB, OP Financial Group, including the Issuer, is currently subject to the SRM Regulation as a primary resolution code instead of the Finnish implementation measures relating to the BRRD.

The SRM Regulation establishes a single European resolution board (the “**SRB**”) having resolution powers over the institutions that are subject to the SRM Regulation, thus replacing or exceeding the powers of the national authorities. The SRB has prepared and adopted a group resolution plan for OP Financial Group and identified the preferred resolution strategy according to which the approach is single point of entry bail-in with the point of entry at the level of the Issuer. The SRB also determines, after consultation with competent authorities, a minimum requirement for own funds and eligible liabilities subject to write-down and conversion powers, which OP Financial Group is required to meet at all times (see the section entitled “*Minimum requirement for own funds and eligible liabilities (“MREL”)*” below). The SRB may also use the powers of early intervention as set forth in the SRM Regulation, including the power to require an institution to contact potential purchasers in order to prepare for resolution of the institution.

A resolution of the Issuer would occur if the SRB determines in accordance with Article 18 of the SRM Regulation that (i) OP Financial Group is failing or likely to fail; (ii) there are no supervisory or private sector measures that can restore OP Financial Group to viability within a short timeframe (for example, by taking actions set out in OP Financial Group's recovery plan); and (iii) resolution is necessary in the public interest (i.e., the resolution objectives would not be met to the same extent if OP Financial Group were wound up under national insolvency proceedings).

In addition to this, other powers granted to the SRB under the SRM Regulation include, among others, a statutory power to write down Tier 1 and Tier 2 capital instruments and unsecured liabilities (except covered deposits and some other liabilities specifically excluded from write-down and conversion) and convert them into Tier 1 instruments (“**bail-in**”). The write down and conversion power can be exercised, either before or after a resolution scheme has been adopted by the SRB for an institution or the group that is failing or likely to fail, in order to ensure that Tier 1 and Tier 2 capital instruments fully absorb losses at the point of non-viability of an institution or its group, and in order to recapitalise such an institution or group.

In particular, the SRB may, pursuant to Articles 21 and 27 of the SRM Regulation and subject to the priority order of claims laid down in Section 4a of Chapter 1 of the Credit Institutions Act, decide to write down the nominal value of the Notes in order to cover the losses of the Issuer and to convert the remaining nominal value of the Notes into instruments eligible for Common Equity Tier 1 (“**CET1**”) capital of the Issuer in order to recapitalise it up to the level determined by the SRB. The SRB, acting in coordination with the Finnish Financial Stability Authority (“**FFSA**”), may also, pursuant to Section 27a of the Amalgamations Act, in the same manner decide to write down the nominal value of the Notes in order to cover the losses of other credit institutions or other financial undertakings belonging to OP Financial Group and to convert the remaining nominal value of the Notes into CET1 eligible instruments of those credit institutions and other financial undertakings or their successor in order to capitalise them up to the level determined by the SRB, if OP Financial Group enters into resolution pursuant to the SRM Regulation and Section 27a of the Amalgamations Act.

If OP Financial Group enters into resolution pursuant to the SRM Regulation, the SRB may use the powers given to resolution authorities under Article 63(1) of the BRRD, as implemented into Finnish legislation, in conjunction with Article 5 of the SRM Regulation and decide to merge one or more such credit institutions or other financial undertakings with the Issuer, in which case the nominal value of the

Notes could be written down to cover losses of all merging credit institutions and other financial undertakings and to convert the remaining nominal value of the Notes into CET1 eligible instruments of the new credit institutions resulting from the merger in order to recapitalise it up to the level determined by the SRB.

Any application of the write down and conversion power shall be in accordance with the hierarchy of claims in normal insolvency proceedings and Section 4 a of Chapter 1 of the Credit Institutions Act. Accordingly, the impact of such application on Noteholders will depend on their ranking in accordance with such hierarchy, including any priority given to other creditors such as depositors.

The SRB, acting in coordination with the FFSA, may also, pursuant to Chapter 12, Section 1 of the Resolution Act, decide to amend or alter the maturity of the Notes, the amount of interest payable under the Notes and the date on which the interest becomes payable and to suspend payments for a predetermined period of time, in accordance with the Resolution Act. The possible exercise of the write down and conversion powers by the SRB, acting in coordination with the FFSA, will be carried out in accordance with the sequence of write down and conversion as set out in Article 48 of the BRRD, as implemented into Finnish legislation.

In addition, the powers granted to the SRB under the SRM Regulation include the following resolution tools: (i) to direct the sale of the relevant financial institution or the whole or part of its business on commercial terms without requiring the consent of the shareholders or complying with the procedural requirements that would otherwise apply, (ii) to transfer all or part of the business of the relevant financial institution to a “bridge bank” (a publicly controlled entity) and (iii) to transfer the assets of the relevant financial institution to an asset management vehicle to allow them to be managed over time. The SRM Regulation also grants powers to enable the SRB to implement the resolution tools, including the power to replace or substitute the relevant financial institution as obligor in respect of debt instruments, the power to modify the terms of debt instruments (including altering the maturity and/or the amount of interest payable and/or imposing a temporary suspension on payments), and/or the power to discontinue the listing and admission to trading of financial instruments. National resolution authorities are responsible for the execution of a resolution scheme according to the instructions of the SRB.

The resolution tools are intended to be used prior to the point at which any insolvency proceedings with respect to the relevant financial institution could have been initiated and only upon the SRB being satisfied that the relevant conditions for resolution contained in the SRM Regulation have been met. The SRM Regulation contains safeguards for shareholders and creditors in respect of the application of the “bail-in tool” which aim to ensure that they do not incur greater losses than they would have incurred had the relevant financial institution been wound up under normal insolvency proceedings. To the extent any resulting treatment of Noteholders pursuant to the exercise of the “bail-in” power is less favourable than would have been the case under such hierarchy in normal insolvency proceedings, a Noteholder has a right to compensation under the SRM Regulation based on an independent valuation of an institution (which is referred to as the “no creditor worse off” principle under the SRM Regulation). Any such compensation is unlikely to compensate that Noteholder for the losses it has actually incurred and there is likely to be a considerable delay in the recovery of such compensation. Where a Noteholder would not have received any distribution in normal insolvency proceedings there will be no compensation at all.

The exercise of any resolution power or any suggestion of any such exercise could materially adversely affect the value of any Notes and could lead to Noteholders losing some or all of the value of their investment in the Notes. In particular, the exercise of the bail-in tool pursuant to Article 27 of the SRM Regulation in respect of the Issuer and the Notes or any suggestion of any such exercise could materially adversely affect the rights of Noteholders, the price or value of their investment in the Notes and/or the Issuer’s ability to satisfy its obligations under the Notes and could lead to Noteholders losing some or all of the value of their investment in such Notes.

Minimum requirement for own funds and eligible liabilities (“MREL”)

The BRRD (and consequently the Resolution Act) and the SRM Regulation introduced the requirement for firms to meet the MREL designed to ensure sufficient loss absorbing capacity to enable the continuity of critical functions without recourse to public funds. All relevant institutions must meet an individual MREL requirement, calculated as a percentage of total liabilities and own funds and set by the relevant

resolution authorities. The European Commission has adopted regulatory technical standards on criteria to be considered by resolution authorities when setting MREL on a firm-by-firm basis. MREL decisions implementing the framework and the policy are made on an annual basis.

The SRB updated the MREL requirement for OP Financial Group in March 2023. As part of the MREL, the resolution authority has updated OP Financial Group's subordination requirement in accordance with the SRM Regulation. The subordination requirement determines how much of the MREL requirement must be fulfilled with own funds or subordinated liabilities. The MREL requirement is 22.30% of the total risk exposure and 26.41% of the total risk exposure including a combined buffer requirement ("CBR"), and 7.40% of leverage ratio exposures. The updated subordination requirement supplementing the MREL requirement was decreased to 14.66% of the total risk exposure amount and 18.77% of the total risk exposure amount including a CBR, and 7.40% of leverage ratio exposures. This took effect on 15 March 2023.

From the beginning of 2024, the MREL requirement will be 22.89% of the total risk exposure and 27.07% of the total risk exposure including a CBR, and 7.40% of leverage ratio exposures. The requirements include a CBR of 4.11%.

OP Financial Group's buffer for MREL was EUR 7.9 billion and for the subordination requirement EUR 5.6 billion as at 31 December 2023. The amount of senior non-preferred bonds issued by OP Financial Group totalled EUR 3.8 billion as at 31 December 2023. These bonds, in addition to own funds, provide funds for the MREL subordination requirement.

OP Financial Group exceeds the new MREL requirement. As at 31 December 2023, OP Financial Group's MREL ratio was 37.1% of the total risk exposure amount and, based on the subordination requirement, the MREL ratio for subordinated liabilities was 26.4% of leverage ratio exposures.

Items eligible for inclusion in MREL include an institution's own funds (within the meaning of CRD), along with "eligible liabilities", meaning liabilities which, among other things, are issued and fully paid up, have a maturity of at least one year (or do not give the investor a right to repayment within one year), and do not arise from derivatives. The MREL subordination requirement has to be met through the issuance of contractual bail-in instruments that are effectively subordinated to other unsubordinated ineligible liabilities in a bail-in or insolvency of the relevant institution.

The issuance of new eligible liabilities for OP Financial Group may increase its compliance costs, delay, limit or restrict the execution of OP Financial Group's strategy and may have an adverse effect on OP Financial Group's capital structure as well as on its business, financial condition and results of operations. MREL requirements are expected to have an impact across the market including a potentially adverse effect on the credit rating of the securities issued by OP Financial Group (including the Notes issued by the Issuer) and its competitors, and there is a risk that the relative impact may give rise to a reduction in the competitiveness of OP Financial Group. If OP Financial Group were to experience difficulties in raising MREL, it may have to reduce its lending or investments in other operations.

Depositor Preference

In line with the BRRD, the Financial Stability Authority Act sets out a preference in the insolvency hierarchy for certain deposits that are eligible for protection by the Finnish deposit guarantee scheme and the uninsured element of such deposits and, in certain circumstances, deposits made in non-EEA branches of EEA credit institutions. The insured deposits cover a wide range of deposits, including consumer deposits, corporate deposits (unless the depositor is a public sector body or financial institution) and some temporary high value deposits. All such preferred deposits will rank in the insolvency hierarchy ahead of all other unsecured senior creditors of the Issuer, including the Noteholders. Furthermore, insured deposits are excluded from the scope of the bail-in tool. As a result, if the bail-in tool were exercised by the Resolution Authority, the Notes would be more likely to be bailed-in than certain other unsubordinated liabilities of the Issuer such as other preferred deposits. In addition, Section 4a of Chapter 1 of the Credit Institutions Act (as part of the Finnish depositor preference

legislation) contains provisions which further clarify the order of payment of credit institutions' creditors of various deposits.

In April 2023, the European Commission published a proposal to update the existing Crisis Management and Deposit Insurance Framework, consisting of proposals to amend, among other things, the BRRD and the SRM Regulation and adopt a general depositor preference, which if implemented may negatively affect the ranking of the Senior Preferred Notes as against all deposits and, as a result, the credit ratings assigned to such Senior Preferred Notes.

The Issuer may be subject to statutory resolution

The powers set out in the BRRD, as implemented into Finnish legislation, and the SRM Regulation will impact how European credit institutions and investment firms are managed as well as, in certain circumstances, the rights of creditors.

The application of the applicable resolution legislation and its effects on the Issuer, OP Financial Group and the Notes are inherently unpredictable and they may be beyond the Issuer's control. The resolution authority can decide to write down the nominal value of the Notes and convert them into shares of the Issuer in order to absorb losses of the Issuer or other Affiliated Credit Institutions, if the amalgamation is entered into resolution. The exercise of any power under the BRRD, as implemented into Finnish legislation, or SRM Regulation or any suggestion of, or perception of there being an increased likelihood of, such exercise could materially adversely affect the rights of Noteholders, the price or value of the Notes and/or the ability of the Issuer to satisfy its obligations under the Notes. Prospective investors in the Notes should consult their own adviser(s) as to the possible consequences of the BRRD, as implemented into Finnish legislation, and the SRM Regulation (for more information, see above).

Under the terms of the Notes, investors will agree to be bound by and consent to the exercise of any bail-in power by the SRB

The Notes may be subject to the exercise, in the future, of a bail-in power by the SRB, and the Notes include a contractual consent to the application of the SRB's bail-in power and, consequently, investors may lose part or all of their investment in the Notes. See Condition 4.5 ("Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers").

By acquiring Notes, each Noteholder and each beneficial owner acknowledges, accepts, consents and agrees to be bound by (a) the effect of the exercise of any bail-in power by the SRB that may include and result in any of the following, or some combination thereof: (i) the reduction of all, or a portion, of the principal amount of, or any interest on, the Notes or any other outstanding amounts due under, or in respect of, the Notes; (ii) the conversion of all, or a portion, of the principal amount of, or any interest on, the Notes or any other outstanding amounts due under, or in respect of, the Notes into shares, other securities or other obligations of the Issuer or another person (and the issue to or conferral on the Noteholder of such shares, securities or obligations), including by means of an amendment, modification or variation of the terms of the Notes; (iii) the cancellation of the Notes; (iv) the amendment or alteration of the maturity of the Notes or amendment of the amount of interest payable on the Notes, or the date on which the interest becomes payable, including by suspending payment for a temporary period; and (b) the variation of the terms of the Notes, if necessary, to give effect to the exercise of any bail-in power by the SRB. The exercise of any such powers or any suggestion of, or perception of there being an increased likelihood of, such exercise could materially adversely affect the rights of Noteholders, the price or value of the Notes and/or the ability of the Issuer to satisfy its obligations under the Notes. See Condition 4.5 ("Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers").

Conditions of the Notes

The following are the Conditions which, as supplemented, amended, modified or replaced by an applicable Pricing Supplement, apply to each Note constituted by the Deed Poll (specified in the Pricing Supplement). References to the "Pricing Supplement" in these conditions do not limit the provisions which may be supplemented, amended, modified or replaced by the Pricing Supplement in relation to a particular Series of Notes. Each Noteholder, and each person claiming through or under each such Noteholder, is bound by and is deemed to have notice of, the Information Memorandum, the provisions of the Deed Poll and these Conditions (including any Pricing Supplement). Copies of these documents are available for inspection upon request at the Specified Office of the Issuer or the Registrar.

1 Interpretation

1.1 Definitions

In these Conditions the following expressions have the following meanings:

Additional Amount means an additional amount payable by the Issuer under Condition 11.2 ("Withholding tax");

Additional Tier 1 Capital means additional tier 1 capital for the purposes of the Applicable Banking Regulations;

Agency Agreement means:

- (a) the agreement entitled "Agency and Registry Services Agreement" and dated 28 August 2015 between the Issuer and Citigroup Pty Limited (ABN 88 004 325 080);
- (b) any other agreement between the Issuer and a Registrar in relation to the establishment and maintenance of a Register (and/or the performance of any payment or other duties) for any issue of Notes; and/or
- (c) any other agency agreement between the Issuer and an Agent in connection with any issue of Notes;

Agent means each of the Registrar, the Issuing and Paying Agent, the Calculation Agent and any additional agent appointed under an Agency Agreement, or any of them as the context requires;

Amalgamations Act means the Finnish Act on Amalgamations of Deposit Banks (in Finnish: *Laki talletuspankkien yhteenliittymästä*, 599/2010), as amended;

Amortised Face Amount means, in respect of a Zero Coupon Note, an amount equal to the sum of:

- (a) the Reference Price specified in the Pricing Supplement; and
- (b) the amount resulting from the application of the Accrual Yield specified in the Pricing Supplement (compounded annually) to the Reference Price from (and including) the Issue Date to (but excluding) the later of:
 - (i) the date fixed for redemption or (as the case may be) the earlier date the Note becomes due and repayable; and
 - (ii) the date on which payment is made to Noteholder under Condition 9.10 ("Late payment"),

as further adjusted, if applicable, in the manner specified in the Pricing Supplement;

If the calculation is to be made for a period which is not a whole number of years, the calculation in respect of the period of less than a full year must be made on the basis of the Day Count Fraction specified in the Pricing Supplement;

Applicable Banking Regulations means at any time the laws, regulations, requirements, guidelines and policies relating to capital adequacy (whether on a risk-weighted or other basis), prudential supervision (including the required features of own funds instruments) or resolution then in effect in the Republic of Finland including, without limitation to the generality of the foregoing, the CRD Implementing Measures, the CRD Directive, the SRM Regulation, BRRD, the Creditor Hierarchy Directive, and those regulations, requirements, guidelines and policies relating to capital adequacy (whether on a risk-weighted or other basis), prudential supervision (including the required features of own funds instruments) or resolution adopted by the EU Commission, the ECB, the FIN-FSA or the SRB from time to time and then in effect (whether or not such requirements, guidelines or policies have the force of law and whether or not they are applied generally or specifically to OP Amalgamation and/or to the Issuer);

Austraclear means Austraclear Ltd (ABN 94 002 060 773);

Austraclear Regulations means the regulations known as the “Austraclear Regulations”, together with any instructions or directions, (as amended or replaced from time to time) established by Austraclear to govern the use of the Austraclear System and binding on the participants in that system;

Austraclear System means the clearing and settlement system operated by Austraclear in Australia for holding securities and electronic recording and settling of transactions in those securities between participants of that system;

Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers means any loss absorption, write-down, conversion, transfer, modification, suspension or similar or resolution related power existing from time to time under, and exercised in compliance with, any laws or directives in effect in the Republic of Finland, relating to (i) the transposition of the BRRD or the application of the SRM Regulation and (ii) the instruments, rules and standards created under the BRRD or the SRM Regulation, pursuant to which any obligation of the Issuer (or any affiliate of the Issuer) can be reduced, cancelled, modified, or converted into shares, other securities or other obligations of the Issuer or any other person (or suspended for a temporary period);

BRRD means Directive 2014/59/EU of 15 May 2014 establishing the framework for the recovery and resolution of credit institutions and investment firms, as the same may be amended or replaced from time to time, including without limitation, as amended by the Creditor Hierarchy Directive and by Directive (EU) 2019/879 of 20 May 2019 of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Directive 2014/59/EU as regards the loss-absorbing and recapitalisation capacity of credit institutions and investment firms;

Business Day means:

- (a) a day on which banks are open for general banking business in Sydney and in each (if any) Relevant Financial Centre specified in the Pricing Supplement (not being a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday in that place); and
- (b) if a Note to be held in a Clearing System is to be issued or a payment is to be made in respect of a Note held in any Clearing System on that day, a day on which each applicable Clearing System in which the relevant Note is lodged is operating;

Business Day Convention means a convention for adjusting any date if it would otherwise fall on a day that is not a Business Day and the following conventions, where specified in the Pricing Supplement in relation to any date applicable to any Note, have the following meanings:

- (a) **Floating Rate Convention** means that the date is postponed to the next following day which is a Business Day unless that day falls in the next calendar month, in which event:
 - (i) that date is brought forward to the first preceding day that is a Business Day; and
 - (ii) each subsequent Interest Payment Date is the last Business Day in the month which falls the number of months or other period specified as the Interest Period in the Pricing Supplement after the preceding applicable Interest Payment Date occurred;
- (b) **Following Business Day Convention** means that the date is postponed to the first following day that is a Business Day;
- (c) **Modified Following Business Day Convention** or **Modified Business Day Convention** means that the date is postponed to the first following day that is a Business Day unless that day falls in the next calendar month in which case that date is brought forward to the first preceding day that is a Business Day;
- (d) **Preceding Business Day Convention** means that the date is brought forward to the first preceding day that is a Business Day; and
- (e) **No Adjustment** means that the relevant date must not be adjusted in accordance with any Business Day Convention.

If no convention is specified in the Pricing Supplement, the Following Business Day Convention applies. Different conventions may be specified in relation to, or apply to, different dates;

Calculation Agent means, in respect of a Note, any person appointed by the Issuer under an Agency Agreement and specified in the Pricing Supplement as the party responsible for calculating the Interest Rate and other amounts required to be calculated under these Conditions, and if no person is specified, the Calculation Agent shall be the Issuer;

Clearing System means:

- (a) the Austraclear System; or
- (b) any other clearing system outside Australia specified in the Pricing Supplement;

Competent Authority means the ECB or such other authority having primary responsibility for the prudential oversight and supervision of the Issuer and/or the OP Amalgamation at the relevant time;

Compliant Instruments means Notes issued directly by the Issuer that:

- (a) have terms which are not materially less favourable to an investor than the terms of the Notes, as reasonably determined by the Issuer, provided that such Notes:
 - (i) contain terms which comply with the then current requirements in relation to the Issuer's and/or the OP Amalgamation's MREL requirement and/or loss absorbing capacity;
 - (ii) include terms which provide for the same Interest Rate, Interest Payment Dates from time to time, Maturity Date and redemption rights applying to the Notes;

- (iii) rank *pari passu* with the Notes; and
 - (iv) shall preserve any existing rights under the Conditions to any accrued interest which has not been satisfied;
- (b) where the Notes have been listed, are listed on an internationally recognised stock exchange as selected by the Issuer; and
- (c) where the Notes which have been substituted or varied had a published solicited rating from a Rating Agency immediately prior to their substitution or variation each such Rating Agency has ascribed, or announced its intention to ascribe, an equal or higher published rating to the relevant Notes (unless any downgrade of the rating is solely attributable to the effectiveness and enforceability of Condition 4.5 (“Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers”).

Conditions means, in relation to a Note, these terms and conditions as amended, supplemented, modified or replaced by the Pricing Supplement applicable to such Note and references to a particular numbered Condition shall be construed accordingly;

CRD means, taken together, the (i) CRD Directive, (ii) the CRR and (iii) any CRD Implementing Measures;

CRD Directive means Directive 2013/36/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 26 June 2013 on access to the activity of credit institutions and the prudential supervision of credit institutions and investment firms, as the same may be amended or replaced from time to time;

CRD Implementing Measures means any regulatory capital rules or regulations, or other requirements, which are applicable to OP Amalgamation and/or the Issuer and which prescribe (alone or in conjunction with any other rules or regulations) the requirements to be fulfilled by financial instruments for their inclusion in the regulatory capital of OP Amalgamation and/or the Issuer (on a solo or consolidated basis, as the case may be) to the extent required by the CRD Directive or the CRR, including for the avoidance of doubt any regulatory technical standards or guidelines released by the European Banking Authority (or any successor or replacement thereof);

Credit Institutions Act means the Finnish Act on Credit Institutions (in Finnish: *laki luottolaitostoininnasta*, 610/2014 as amended);

Creditor Hierarchy Directive means Directive (EU) 2017/2399 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2017 amending Directive 2014/59/EU as regards the ranking of unsecured debt instruments in insolvency hierarchy, or any equivalent legislation that supersedes or replaces it;

CRR means Regulation (EU) No. 575/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 26 June 2013 on prudential requirements for credit institutions and investment firms, as the same may be amended or replaced from time to time;

Day Count Fraction means, in respect of the calculation of interest on a Note for any period of time (“**Calculation Period**”), the day count fraction specified in the Pricing Supplement and:

- (a) if “**Actual/Actual (ICMA)**” is so specified, means:
 - (i) where the Calculation Period is equal to or shorter than the Regular Period during which it falls, the actual number of days in the Calculation Period divided by the product of (1) the actual number of days in such Regular Period, and (2) the number of Regular Periods normally ending in any year; and

- (ii) where the Calculation Period is longer than one Regular Period, the sum of:
 - (A) the actual number of days in such Calculation Period falling in the Regular Period in which it begins divided by the product of (1) the actual number of days in such Regular Period and (2) the number of Regular Periods in any year; and

 - (i) the actual number of days in that portion of the Calculation Period falling in a leap year divided by 366; and
 - (ii) the actual number of days in that portion of the Calculation Period falling in a non-leap year divided by 365);
- (c) if “**Actual/365 (Fixed)**” is so specified, means the actual number of days in the Calculation Period divided by 365;
- (d) if “**Actual/360**” is so specified, means the actual number of days in the Calculation Period divided by 360;
- (e) if “**30/360**”, “**360/360**” or “**Bond Basis**” is so specified, means the number of days in the Calculation Period divided by 360 calculated on a formula basis as follows:

- (f) if “**30E/360**” or “**Eurobond basis**” is so specified, means the number of days in the Calculation Period divided by 360 calculated on a formula basis as follows:

- (h) if “**RBA Bond Basis**” or “**Australian Bond Basis**” is so specified, means one divided by the number of Interest Payment Dates in a year (or where the Calculation Period does not constitute an Interest Period, the actual number of days in the Calculation

Period divided by 365 (or, if any portion of the Calculation Period falls in a leap year, the sum of:

- (i) the actual number of days in that portion of the Calculation Period falling in a leap year divided by 366; and
- (ii) the actual number of days in that portion of the Calculation Period falling in a non-leap year divided by 365));

Deed Poll means:

- (a) the deed poll entitled “Note Deed Poll” dated 28 August 2015; and
- (b) such other deed poll that supplements, amends, restates, modifies or replaces the deed poll referred to above, or which is otherwise acknowledged in writing to be a deed poll for the purposes of the Programme,

in each case, executed by the Issuer;

Denomination means the notional face value of a Note specified in the Pricing Supplement;

Early Redemption Amount means the early redemption amount specified in, or determined in accordance with, the Pricing Supplement;

ECB means the European Central Bank or any successor or substituting authority thereto;

Event of Default means an event so described in Condition 13.1 (“Events of Default”);

FIN-FSA means the Finnish Financial Supervisory Authority (in Finnish: *Finanssivalvonta*) or any successor or substituting authority thereto;

Fixed Rate Note means a Note on which interest is calculated at a fixed rate payable in arrear on a fixed date or fixed dates in each year and on redemption or on any other dates as specified in the Pricing Supplement;

Floating Rate Note means a Note on which interest is calculated at a floating rate payable monthly or 2, 3, 6, or 12 monthly or in respect of any other period or on any other date specified in the Pricing Supplement;

Information Memorandum means, in respect of a Note:

- (a) the Information Memorandum dated 27 March 2024 or the then latest information memorandum which replaces the document; or
- (b) the information memorandum or other offering document referred to in the Pricing Supplement,

in each case, prepared by, or on behalf of, and approved in writing by, the Issuer in connection with the issue of that Note and all documents incorporated by reference in it, including any applicable Pricing Supplement and any other applicable amendments or supplements to it;

Interest Commencement Date means, in respect of a Note, the Issue Date of the Note or any other date so specified in the Pricing Supplement;

Interest Determination Date means each date so specified in, or determined in accordance with, the Pricing Supplement;

Interest Payment Date means each date so specified in, or determined in accordance with, the Pricing Supplement;

Interest Period means each period beginning on (and including) an Interest Payment Date and ending on (but excluding) the next Interest Payment Date. However:

- (a) the first Interest Period commences on (and includes) the Interest Commencement Date; and
- (b) the final Interest Period ends on (but excludes) the Maturity Date;

Interest Rate means, in respect of a Note, the interest rate (expressed as a percentage per annum) payable in respect of that Note specified in the Pricing Supplement or calculated or determined in accordance with these Conditions and the Pricing Supplement;

ISDA means the International Swaps and Derivatives Association, Inc. (or any successor);

ISDA Definitions has the meaning given in the Pricing Supplement;

Issuing and Paying Agent means:

- (a) Citigroup Pty Limited (ABN 88 004 325 080); and/or
- (b) any other person appointed by the Issuer under an Agency Agreement and specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement to perform issuing and paying agency functions on the Issuer's behalf with respect to a Series or Tranche of Notes;

Issue Date means, in respect of a Note, the date on which the Note is, or is to be issued, and as may be specified, or determined, in accordance with, the Pricing Supplement;

Issue Price means the price as set out in the Pricing Supplement;

Issuer means OP Corporate Bank plc;

Junior Securities means any (i) subordinated debt instruments or securities of the Issuer which are recognised (in whole or in part) as Tier 2 Capital of the Issuer from time to time by the Competent Authority, (ii) subordinated and undated debt instruments or securities of the Issuer which are recognised as Additional Tier 1 Capital of the Issuer from time to time by the Competent Authority, (iii) share capital of the Issuer and (iv) any other subordinated security or obligation which ranks, or is expressed to rank, junior to the Senior Non-Preferred Notes;

Margin means the margin specified in, or determined in accordance with, the Pricing Supplement;

Material Subsidiary means at any time a Subsidiary the gross assets of which (or, where the interest in the share capital of such Subsidiary is less than 100%, a proportion thereof equal to the proportion of the share capital owned, directly or indirectly, by the Issuer) represent more than 20% of the consolidated gross assets of the Issuer and its Subsidiaries (taken as a whole);

Maturity Date means, in respect of a Note, the date so specified in, or determined in accordance with, the Pricing Supplement as the date on which the Note is to be redeemed (and adjusted, if necessary, in accordance with the applicable "Business Day Convention" so specified in the Pricing Supplement);

Meeting Provisions means the provisions relating to meetings of Noteholders and set out as a schedule to the Deed Poll;

Member Cooperative Banks means the member cooperative banks of OP Financial Group;

MREL means the minimum requirement for own funds and eligible liabilities implemented by the BRRD (and consequently the Finnish Act on the Resolution of Credit Institutions and Investment Firms (in Finnish: *Laki luottolaitosten ja sijoituspalveluyritysten kriisinratkaisusta*, 1194/2014)) and the SRM Regulation;

Note means each form of bond, note, debt security, or debt obligation specified in an applicable Pricing Supplement and issued or to be issued by the Issuer which is constituted by, and owing under, the Deed Poll and the details of which are recorded in, and evidenced by entry in, the Register. A Note may either be a Senior Preferred Note or a Senior Non-Preferred Note, as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement. References to any particular type of "**Note**" or "**Notes**" shall be read and construed accordingly. All references to Notes must, unless the context otherwise requires, be read and construed as references to the Notes of a particular Series;

Noteholder means, in respect of a Note, each person whose name is entered in the Register as the holder of that Note;

OP Amalgamation means OP Cooperative, its subsidiaries which are credit institutions, financial institutions or ancillary services undertakings within the meaning of the CRD, and the Member Cooperative Banks, which together constitute an amalgamation of deposit banks within the meaning of the Act on Amalgamations of Deposit Banks (in Finnish: *Laki talletuspankkien yhteenliittymästä*, 599/2010), as amended;

OP Financial Group means OP Cooperative, its financial and non-financial subsidiaries and Member Cooperative Banks and includes the Issuer;

Partly Paid Note means a Note in relation to which the initial subscription moneys are payable to the Issuer in two or more instalments;

Permitted Reorganisation means any one or more of the following:

- (a) (in the case of a Material Subsidiary) where the whole or substantially the whole of the business and assets of such Material Subsidiary is vested in another Subsidiary or Subsidiaries of the Issuer or in the Issuer itself;
- (b) (in the case of a Material Subsidiary) the sale of any Material Subsidiary and/or the business and assets of such Material Subsidiary on arm's length terms;

- (d) (where (c) above does not apply) any sale or other transfer (whether by demerger, in whole or in part, or otherwise) of all or part of the business or assets of the Issuer or any Material Subsidiary (if any) to any member of OP Financial Group, *provided that* the provisions of the Amalgamations Act with respect to the joint liability of the members of OP Financial Group in effect immediately prior to the sale or transfer (as the case may be), insofar as they apply to the obligations of the Issuer under the Notes, remain in force immediately following such sale or transfer. For the purposes of these Conditions, any such member of OP Financial Group shall be entitled to assume the entire obligations of the Issuer under the Notes; and/or
- (e) any other reorganisation, reconstruction, amalgamation, merger or consolidation on terms previously approved by an Extraordinary Resolution (as defined in the Deed Poll);

Pricing Supplement means, in respect of a Tranche, the supplement specifying the relevant issue details in relation to that Tranche and which may be substantially in the form set out in the Information Memorandum, duly completed and signed by the Issuer;

Priority Act means the Finnish Act on the Order of Payment of Creditors (in Finnish: *laki velkojien maksunsaantijärjestyksestä*, 1578/1992) as amended;

Programme means the Issuer's uncommitted programme for the issuance of Notes described in the Information Memorandum;

Rating Agency means S&P Global Ratings Europe Limited, Moody's Investors Service (Nordics) AB, their respective successors or any other internationally recognised rating agency rating the Notes immediately prior to their substitution or variation;

Record Date means 5.00 pm in the place where the Register is maintained on the date which is the eighth calendar day before the payment date or any other date so specified in the Pricing Supplement;

Redemption Amount means:

- (a) for a Note (other than a Zero Coupon Note), the outstanding principal amount as at the date of redemption; and
- (b) for a Zero Coupon Note, the Amortised Face Amount calculated as at the date of redemption,

and also includes any final instalment and any other amount in the nature of a redemption amount specified in, or determined in accordance with, the Pricing Supplement or these Conditions;

Redemption Date means, in respect of a Note, such date on which the Note is redeemed prior to its Maturity Date in accordance with these Conditions;

Reference Banks means the institutions so described in the Pricing Supplement or, if none, four major banks selected by the Calculation Agent in the market that is most closely connected with the Reference Rate;

Reference Rate means the rate specified in, or determined in accordance with, the Pricing Supplement;

Register means the register, including any branch register, of Noteholders of Notes established and maintained by the Issuer, or by a Registrar on its behalf under an Agency Agreement;

Registrar means:

- (a) Citigroup Pty Limited (ABN 88 004 325 080); and/or
- (b) any other person appointed by the Issuer under a relevant Agency Agreement to establish and maintain the Register in respect of a Tranche of Notes on the Issuer's behalf from time to time;

Regular Period means:

- (a) in the case of Notes where interest is scheduled to be paid only by means of regular payments, each Interest Period;
- (b) in the case of Notes where, apart from the first Interest Period, interest is scheduled to be paid only by means of regular payments, each period from (and including) a Regular Date falling in any year to (but excluding) the next Regular Date, where "**Regular Date**" means the day and month (but not the year) on which any Interest Payment Date falls; and
- (c) in the case of Notes where, apart from one Interest Period other than the first Interest Period, interest is scheduled to be paid only by means of regular payments, each period from (and including) a Regular Date falling in any year to (but excluding) the next Regular Date, where "**Regular Date**" means the day and month (but not the year) on which any Interest Payment Date falls other than the Interest Payment Date falling at the end of the irregular Interest Period;

Relevant Amounts means the outstanding principal amount of the Notes, together with any accrued but unpaid interest and additional amounts due on the Notes. References to such amounts will include amounts that have become due and payable, but which have not been paid, prior to the exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Competent Authority and/or the Resolution Authority;

Relevant Date means the date on which such payment first becomes due and payable, but if the full amount of the moneys payable has not been received by the Agent on or prior to such due date, it means the first date on which the full amount of such moneys has been so received and notice to that effect shall have been duly given to the Noteholders of the relevant Series in accordance with Condition 19 ("Notices");

Relevant Financial Centre means any centre specified in the Pricing Supplement;

Relevant Screen Page means:

- (a) the page, section or other part of a particular information service specified as the Relevant Screen Page in the Pricing Supplement; or
- (b) any other page, section or other part as may replace it on that information service or such other information service, in each case, as may be nominated by the person providing or sponsoring the information appearing there for the purpose of displaying rates or prices comparable to the Reference Rate;

Relevant Time has the meaning given in the Pricing Supplement;

Resolution Authority means the SRB, or any successor to or replacement for the SRB and/or any resolution authority with the ability to exercise any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers in relation to the Issuer and/or OP Amalgamation or with primary responsibility for the oversight and supervision of the Issuer's and/or OP Amalgamation's MREL requirement and/or loss absorbing capacity from time to time;

Security Record has the meaning given in the Austraclear Regulations;

Senior Non-Preferred Notes has the meaning given in Condition 4.2 (“Status and ranking – Senior Non-Preferred Notes”);

Senior Preferred Notes has the meaning given in Condition 4.1 (“Status and ranking – Senior Preferred Notes”);

Series means an issue of Notes made up of one or more Tranches all of which form a single Series and are issued on the same Conditions except that the Issue Price, Issue Date and Interest Commencement Date may be different in respect of a different Tranche of a Series;

Specified Office means the office specified in the Information Memorandum or any other address notified to Noteholders from time to time;

SRB means the single European resolution board established by the SRM Regulation;

SRM Regulation means Regulation (EU) No. 806/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 15 July 2014, establishing uniform rules and a uniform procedure for the resolution of credit institutions and certain investment firms in the framework of a Single Resolution Mechanism and a Single Resolution Fund, as the same may be amended or replaced from time to time;

Subsidiary means any company or other entity whose accounts are for the time being, or, in the case of a company or other entity acquired after the date of the Issuer’s most recent accounts, will be consolidated with those of the Issuer for the purposes of the consolidated accounts of the Issuer issued to shareholders of the Issuer;

Tax Authority means any government, state, municipal, local, federal or other fiscal, revenue, customs or excise authority, body or official, having power to tax to which the Issuer becomes subject in respect of payments made by it of principal or interest in respect of the Notes;

Taxes means taxes, levies, withholdings, deductions, assessments or governmental charges of whatever nature imposed or levied by any Tax Authority together with any related interest, penalties, fines and expenses in connection with them except if imposed on, or calculated having regard to, the net income of a Noteholder;

Tier 2 Capital means tier 2 capital for the purposes of the Applicable Banking Regulations;

Tranche means an issue of Notes specified as such in the Pricing Supplement issued on the same Issue Date and on the same Conditions; and

Zero Coupon Note means a Note which does not carry entitlement to periodic payment of interest before the redemption date of the Note and which is issued at a discount to its principal amount.

1.2 References to certain general terms

Unless the contrary intention appears, a reference in these Conditions to:

- (a) a group of persons (other than the Noteholders) is a reference to any two or more of them jointly and to each of them individually;
- (b) a document (including these Conditions) includes any variation or replacement of it;
- (c) a “**law**” includes common law, principles of equity, decree and any statute or other law made by any parliament (and a statute or other law made by parliament includes any regulation and other instrument under it and any consolidation, amendment, re-enactment or replacement of it);

- (d) a “**directive**” includes a treaty, official directive, request, regulation, guideline or policy (whether or not having the force of law) with which responsible participants in the relevant market generally comply;
- (e) “**Australian dollars**” or “**A\$**” is a reference to the lawful currency of Australia;
- (f) “**€**”, “**Euro**”, “**EUR**” or “**euro**” is a reference to the lawful currency of the member states of the European Union that have adopted the single currency in accordance with the Treaty establishing the European Community, as amended from time to time;
- (g) a time of day is a reference to Sydney time;
- (h) a “**person**” includes an individual, corporation, company, firm, tribunal, undertaking, association, organisation, partnership, joint venture, trust, limited liability company, unincorporated organisation or government or any agency, instrumentality or political subdivision thereof; in each case whether or not being a separate legal entity;
- (i) a particular person includes a reference to the person’s executors, administrators, successors, substitutes (including persons taking by novation) and assigns;
- (j) an agreement, representation or warranty in favour of two or more persons is for the benefit of them jointly and each of them individually;
- (k) a reference to the “**Corporations Act**” is to the Corporations Act 2001 of Australia;
- (l) anything (including any amount) is a reference to the whole and each part of it; and
- (m) the words “**including**”, “**for example**” or “**such as**” when introducing an example, do not limit the meaning of the words to which the example relates to that example or examples of a similar kind.

1.3 References to particular terms

Unless the contrary intention appears, in these Conditions:

- (a) a reference to an Agency Agreement is a reference to each Agency Agreement applicable to the Notes of the relevant Series;
- (b) a reference to an Agent is a reference to each Agent appointed to act in respect of Notes of the relevant Series;
- (c) a reference to the Deed Poll is a reference to the Deed Poll applicable to the Notes of the relevant Series;
- (d) a reference to a Note is a reference to a Note of a particular Series specified in the Pricing Supplement;
- (e) a reference to a Noteholder is a reference to the holder of Notes of a particular Series;
- (f) a reference to a Pricing Supplement is a reference to the Pricing Supplement applicable to the Notes of the particular Tranche specified in that Pricing Supplement;
- (g) if the Notes are Zero Coupon Notes, references to interest are not applicable; and
- (h) a reference to a particular date is a reference to that date adjusted in accordance with the applicable Business Day Convention (provided that in the case of Fixed Rate Notes only, such adjustment shall be for the purposes of payment but not accrual).

1.4 References to principal and interest

Unless the contrary intention appears, in these Conditions:

- (a) any reference to “**principal**” is taken to include the Redemption Amount, any Additional Amounts in respect of principal which may be payable under Condition 11 (“Taxation”), any premium payable in respect of a Note, and any other amount in the nature of principal payable in respect of the Notes under these Conditions;
- (b) the principal amount of a Note issued at a discount is to be taken as at any time to equal the lesser of:
 - (i) its Denomination; and
 - (ii) if specified in the Pricing Supplement, its Amortised Face Amount at that time;
- (c) the principal amount of a Note which is to vary by reference to a schedule or formula (where such determination has been previously made in accordance with these Conditions) is to be taken as at any time to equal its varied amount;
- (d) the principal amount of a Partly Paid Note is to be taken to equal its paid up principal amount; and
- (e) any reference to “**interest**” is taken to include any Additional Amounts and any other amount in the nature of interest payable in respect of the Notes under these Conditions.

1.5 Number

The singular includes the plural and vice versa.

1.6 Headings

Headings (including those in brackets at the beginning of paragraphs) are for convenience only and do not affect the interpretation of these Conditions.

1.7 Terms defined in Pricing Supplement

Terms which are defined in the Pricing Supplement as having a defined meaning have the same meaning when used in these Conditions but if the Pricing Supplement gives no meaning or specifies that the definition is “Not Applicable”, then that definition is not applicable to the Notes.

2 Introduction

2.1 Programme

Notes are issued under the Programme.

2.2 Pricing Supplement

- (a) Notes are issued in Series. A Series may comprise one or more Tranches having one or more Issue Dates and on conditions otherwise identical (other than, to the extent relevant, in respect of the Issue Price, Issue Date and Interest Commencement Date).
- (b) The Issuer will issue Notes on the terms set out in these Conditions as supplemented, amended, modified or replaced by the Pricing Supplement applicable to those Notes. If there is any inconsistency between these Conditions and the Pricing Supplement, the Pricing Supplement prevails.

- (c) Copies of the Pricing Supplement for a Tranche of Notes are available for inspection or upon request by a Noteholder or prospective Noteholder during normal business hours at the Specified Office of the Issuer or the Registrar or are otherwise available on reasonable request from the Issuer or the Registrar.

2.3 Types of Notes

A Note is either:

- (a) a Fixed Rate Note;
- (b) a Floating Rate Note; or
- (c) a Zero Coupon Note,

or a combination of the above (or any other type of debt obligation, including a certificate of deposit), as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement.

2.4 Issue and transfer restrictions

Unless otherwise specified in the Pricing Supplement, Notes may only be offered (directly or indirectly) for issue or transfer, or applications invited for the issue or transfer of Notes, and may only be issued or transferred, if:

- (a) where the offer or invitation is made in, or into, Australia:
 - (i) the aggregate consideration payable to the Issuer or the transferor by the relevant subscriber or person acquiring the Notes is at least A\$500,000 (or its equivalent in an alternative currency and, in either case, disregarding moneys lent by the Issuer or its associates to the subscriber) and the offer or invitation (including any resulting issue) or transfer does not otherwise require disclosure to investors under Parts 6D.2 or 7.9 of the Corporations Act;
 - (ii) the offer or invitation (including any resulting issue) or transfer does not constitute an offer to a “retail client” as defined for the purposes of section 761G of the Corporations Act; and
 - (iii) the offer or invitation (including any resulting issue) or transfer complies with the Banking exemption No. 1 of 2018 dated 21 March 2018 promulgated by the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority as if it applied to the Issuer *mutatis mutandis* (including that the Notes the subject of the offer or invitation, when issued, have an aggregate principal amount of at least A\$500,000); and
- (b) at all times, the offer or invitation (including any resulting issue) or transfer complies with all applicable laws and directives in the jurisdiction in which the offer, invitation or issue or transfer takes place.

2.5 Denomination

Notes are issued in the single Denomination as specified in the Pricing Supplement.

2.6 Currency

Subject to compliance with all applicable legal and regulatory requirements, Notes may be denominated in Australian dollars or such other freely transferable and freely available currency or currencies as specified in the Pricing Supplement.

2.7 Clearing Systems

If the Notes are held in a Clearing System, the rights of a person holding an interest in those Notes are subject to the rules and regulations of the Clearing System including any removal, uplift or withdrawal (however described) of the Notes from that Clearing System or other action (including a transfer of the Notes) required by the rules and regulations of the Clearing System. The Issuer is not responsible for anything the Clearing System does or omits to do.

3 Form

3.1 Constitution

- (a) Notes are debt obligations of the Issuer constituted by, and owing under, the Deed Poll and the details of which are recorded in, and evidenced by entry in, the Register.
- (b) Noteholders are entitled to the benefit of, are bound by, and are deemed to have notice of all the provisions of the Deed Poll.

3.2 Form

Notes are issued in registered uncertificated form by entry in the Register.

3.3 No certificates

No certificates in respect of any Notes will be issued to Noteholders unless the Issuer determines that certificates should be available or are required by any applicable law or directive.

4 Status and ranking and Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers

4.1 Status and ranking – Senior Preferred Notes

This Condition 4.1 is applicable in relation to Notes specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being Senior Preferred Notes (“Senior Preferred Notes”).

- (a) The Senior Preferred Notes constitute unsubordinated and unsecured obligations of the Issuer and rank *pari passu* without any preference among themselves and at least *pari passu* with all other present or future unsecured and unsubordinated indebtedness of the Issuer, subject to statutorily preferred exceptions.
- (b) The rights of holders of Senior Preferred Notes shall be subject to any present or future Finnish laws or regulations relating to the recovery and resolution of credit institutions and investment firms in the Republic of Finland which are or will be applicable to the Senior Preferred Notes only as a result of the operation of such laws or regulations.

4.2 Status and ranking – Senior Non-Preferred Notes

This Condition 4.2 is applicable in relation to Notes specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being Senior Non-Preferred Notes (“Senior Non-Preferred Notes”).

- (a) The Senior Non-Preferred Notes constitute direct and unsecured obligations of the Issuer and rank and will rank *pari passu* without any preference among themselves.
- (b) In the event of the winding-up, insolvency or bankruptcy of the Issuer, the rights and claims (if any) of holders of any Senior Non-Preferred Notes to payments of the principal amount and any other amounts in respect of the Senior Non-Preferred Notes (including any accrued but unpaid interest amount, damages or other payments awarded for breach of any obligations under these Conditions, if any are payable) shall:

- (i) be subordinated to the claims of all depositors and other unsecured, unsubordinated creditors of the Issuer (including Senior Preferred Notes), provided that in each case such claims are not by mandatory provisions of law ranked, or by their terms expressed to rank, *pari passu* with or subordinated to the claims of holders of Senior Non-Preferred Notes;
- (ii) rank at least *pari passu* with the claims of all other creditors of the Issuer which in each case by law rank, or by their terms are expressed to rank, *pari passu* with the claims of holders of Senior Non-Preferred Notes; and
- (iii) rank senior to any Junior Securities of the Issuer.

The rights of holders of Senior Non-Preferred Notes shall be subject to any present or future Finnish laws or regulations relating to the recovery and resolution of credit institutions and investment firms in the Republic of Finland which are or will be applicable to the Senior Non-Preferred Notes only as a result of the operation of such laws or regulations.

- (c) For the purposes of Finnish law, in the event of bankruptcy of the Issuer, the rights and claims (if any) of holders of any Senior Non-Preferred Notes to payments of the outstanding principal amount and any other amounts in respect of the Senior Non-Preferred Notes (including any accrued and unpaid interest amount, damages or other payments awarded for breach of any obligations under these Conditions, if any are payable) shall constitute claims as referred to in item 4 of Chapter 1, Section 4a, Subsection 1 of the Credit Institutions Act, ranking below claims as referred to in Section 2 of the Priority Act, and ranking above claims referred to in Section 6, Subsection 1 of the Priority Act.

4.3 No set-off

No Noteholder shall be entitled to exercise any right of set-off or netting against moneys owed by the Issuer in respect of such Notes. If, notwithstanding the preceding sentence, any Noteholder receives or recovers any sum or the benefit of any sum in respect of any Note by virtue of any such set-off or netting, it shall hold the same on trust for the Issuer and shall pay the amount thereof to the Issuer or, in the event of the winding up of the Issuer, to the liquidator of the Issuer.

4.4 No security or guarantee

No security or guarantee of whatever kind is, or shall at any time be, provided by the Issuer or any other person securing rights of the Noteholders under the Notes.

4.5 Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers

The possible exercise of the Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Resolution Authority will be carried out in accordance with the sequence of write down and conversion as set out in Article 48 of the BRRD, as implemented into Finnish legislation.

- (a) Notwithstanding, and to the exclusion of, any other term of the Notes or any other agreements, arrangements or understanding between the Issuer and any Noteholder, by its acquisition of the Notes, each Noteholder acknowledges and accepts that any liability arising under the Notes may be subject to the exercise of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Competent Authority and/or Resolution Authority and acknowledges, accepts, consents to and agrees to be bound by:
 - (i) the effect of the exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Competent Authority and/or the Resolution Authority, which exercise (without limitation) may include and result in any of the following, or a combination thereof:

- (A) the reduction of all, or a portion, of the Relevant Amounts in respect of the Notes;
 - (B) the conversion of all, or a portion, of the Relevant Amounts into shares, other securities or other obligations of the Issuer or another person, and the issue to or conferral on the Noteholder of such shares, securities or obligations, including by means of an amendment, modification or variation of the terms of the Notes;
 - (C) the cancellation of the Notes or the Relevant Amounts in respect of the Notes; and
 - (D) amendment of the amount of interest payable on the Notes, or the date on which interest becomes payable, including by suspending payment for a temporary period; and
- (ii) the variation of the Conditions, if necessary, to give effect to the exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Competent Authority and/or the Resolution Authority.
- (b) By its acquisition of the Notes, each Noteholder:
- (i) acknowledges, accepts, consents and agrees to be bound by the exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers as it may be exercised without any prior notice by the Competent Authority and/or the Resolution Authority of its decision to exercise such power with respect to such Notes; and
 - (ii) shall be deemed to have authorised, directed and requested each Clearing System, any accountholder in a Clearing System or other intermediary through which it holds such Notes to take any and all necessary action, if required, to implement the exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers with respect to such Notes as it may be exercised, without any further action or direction on the part of such Noteholder, the Registrar or each other Agent.
- (c) Upon the exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Competent Authority and/or the Resolution Authority with respect to the Notes, the Issuer will provide a written notice to the Noteholders in accordance with Condition 19 (“Notices”) as soon as practicable regarding such exercise of the Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers for the purpose of notifying Noteholders of such occurrence. Any delay or failure by the Issuer in delivering any notice referred to in this Condition 4.5 shall not affect the validity or enforceability of such exercise of the Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers. The Issuer will also deliver a copy of such notice to the Registrar and each other Agent for information purposes.
- (d) Neither a reduction or cancellation, in part or in full, of the principal or any other redemption amount of, or any interest on, the Notes or any other outstanding amounts due under or in respect of the Notes, the conversion thereof into another security or obligation of the Issuer or another person, as a result of the exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Competent Authority and/or the Resolution Authority with respect to the Notes, nor the exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Competent Authority and/or the Resolution Authority with respect to the Notes pursuant to this Condition 4.5 (“Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers”), will be an Event of Default or give rise to any acceleration rights in respect of the Notes.

For the purposes of this Condition 4.5 (“Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers”), a reference to “**Noteholders**” includes each holder of a beneficial interest in the Notes.

5 Title and transfer of Notes

5.1 Title

Title to a Note passes when details of the transfer are entered in the Register.

5.2 Effect of entries in Register

Each entry in the Register in respect of a Note constitutes:

- (a) an irrevocable undertaking by the Issuer to the Noteholder to:
 - (i) pay principal, any interest and any other amounts in accordance with these Conditions; and
 - (ii) otherwise to comply with the Conditions; and
- (b) an entitlement to the other benefits given to Noteholders under these Conditions in respect of the Note.

5.3 Ownership and non-recognition of interests

- (a) Entries in the Register in relation to a Note constitute conclusive evidence that the person so entered is the absolute owner of such Note subject to correction for fraud or proven error.
- (b) No notice of any trust or other interest in, or claim to, any Note will be entered in a Register. Neither the Issuer nor the relevant Registrar need take notice of any trust or other interest in, or claim to, any Note, except as ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction or required by any applicable law or directive. This Condition 5.3(b) applies whether or not a Note is overdue.

5.4 Joint holders

Where two or more persons are entered in the Register as the joint holders of a Note then they are taken to hold the Note as joint tenants with rights of survivorship, but the Registrar is not bound to register more than four persons as joint holders of a Note.

5.5 Transfer

Noteholders may only transfer Notes in accordance with these Conditions.

5.6 Transfers in whole

Notes may be transferred in whole but not in part.

5.7 Transfer procedures

Interests in Notes held in a Clearing System will be transferable only in accordance with the rules and regulations of that Clearing System. If a Note is lodged in the Austraclear System, neither the Issuer nor the relevant Registrar will recognise any such interest other than the interest of Austraclear as the Noteholder while that Note is lodged in the Austraclear System.

5.8 Austraclear as Noteholder

If Austraclear is recorded in the Register as the Noteholder, each person in whose Security Record a Note is recorded is taken to acknowledge in favour of the Issuer, the Registrar and Austraclear that:

- (a) the Registrar's decision to act as the Registrar of that Note is not a recommendation or endorsement by the Registrar or Austraclear in relation to that Note, but only indicates that the Registrar considers that the holding of the Note is compatible with the performance by it of its obligations as Registrar under the Agency Agreement; and
- (b) the Noteholder does not rely on any fact, matter or circumstance contrary to paragraph (a).

5.9 Restrictions on transfers

Transfers of Notes which are not lodged in a Clearing System cannot be made between a Record Date and the relevant Interest Payment Date if a redemption of such Note is to occur during that period in accordance with these Conditions.

5.10 Effect of transfer

Upon registration and entry of the transferee in the Register the transferor ceases to be entitled to future benefits under these Conditions in respect of the transferred Note and the transferee becomes so entitled in accordance with Condition 5.2 ("Effect of entries in Register").

5.11 CHESS

Notes which are listed on the Australian Securities Exchange operated by ASX Limited (ABN 98 008 624 691) will not be transferred through, or registered on, the Clearing House Electronic Subregister System operated by ASX Settlement Pty Limited (ABN 49 008 504 532) and will not be "Approved Financial Products" for the purposes of that system.

5.12 Estates

A person becoming entitled to a Note as a consequence of the death or bankruptcy of a Noteholder or of a vesting order or a person administering the estate of a Noteholder may, upon producing such evidence as to that entitlement or status as the Registrar considers sufficient, transfer the Note or, if so entitled, become registered as the holder of the Note.

5.13 Unincorporated associations

A transfer of a Note to an unincorporated association is not permitted.

5.14 Transfer of unidentified Notes

If a Noteholder transfers some but not all of the Notes it holds and the transfer form does not identify the specific Notes transferred, the relevant Registrar may choose which Notes registered in the name of Noteholder have been transferred. However, the aggregate principal amounts of the Notes registered as transferred must equal the aggregate principal amount of the Notes expressed to be transferred in the transfer form.

6 Fixed Rate Notes

This Condition 6 applies to the Notes only if the Pricing Supplement states that it applies.

6.1 Interest on Fixed Rate Notes

Each Fixed Rate Note bears interest on its outstanding principal amount from (and including) its Interest Commencement Date to (but excluding) its Maturity Date at the Interest Rate. Interest is payable in arrear on each Interest Payment Date.

6.2 Fixed Coupon Amount

Unless otherwise specified in the Pricing Supplement, the amount of interest payable on each Interest Payment Date in respect of the preceding Interest Period is the Fixed Coupon Amount specified in the Pricing Supplement.

6.3 Calculation of interest payable

The amount of interest payable in respect of a Fixed Rate Note for any period for which a Fixed Coupon Amount is not specified in the Pricing Supplement is calculated by multiplying the Interest Rate for that period, by the outstanding principal amount of the Fixed Rate Note and the applicable Day Count Fraction.

7 Floating Rate Notes

This Condition 7 applies to the Notes only if the Pricing Supplement states that it applies.

7.1 Interest on Floating Rate Notes

Each Floating Rate Note bears interest on its outstanding principal amount from (and including) its Interest Commencement Date to (but excluding) its Maturity Date at the Interest Rate.

Interest is payable in arrear:

- (a) on each Interest Payment Date; or
- (b) if no Interest Payment Date is specified in the Pricing Supplement, on each date which falls the number of months or other period specified as the Specified Period in the Pricing Supplement after the preceding Interest Payment Date (or in the case of the first Interest Payment Date, after the Interest Commencement Date).

7.2 Interest Rate determination

The Interest Rate payable in respect of a Floating Rate Note must be determined by the Calculation Agent in accordance with these Conditions.

7.3 Fallback Interest Rate

Unless otherwise specified in the Pricing Supplement, if, in respect of an Interest Period, the Calculation Agent is unable to determine a rate in accordance with Condition 7.2 ("Interest Rate determination"), the Interest Rate for the Interest Period is the Interest Rate applicable to the Floating Rate Notes during the immediately preceding Interest Period.

7.4 ISDA Determination

Where "ISDA Determination" is specified in the Pricing Supplement as the manner in which the Interest Rate is to be determined, the Interest Rate for each Interest Period is the sum of the Margin and the ISDA Rate.

In this Condition 7.4:

- (a) "ISDA Rate" for an Interest Period, means a rate equal to the Floating Rate that would be determined by the Calculation Agent under a Swap Transaction if the Calculation Agent for the Floating Rate Notes were acting as Calculation Agent for that Swap Transaction under the terms of an agreement incorporating the ISDA Definitions and under which:
 - (i) the Floating Rate Option, the Designated Maturity and the Reset Date are as specified in the Pricing Supplement; and

- (ii) the Period End Dates are each Interest Payment Date, the Spread is the Margin and the Floating Rate Day Count Fraction is the Day Count Fraction; and
- (b) **“Swap Transaction”, “Floating Rate”, “Calculation Agent”** (except references to “Calculation Agent for the Floating Rate Notes”), **“Floating Rate Option”, “Designated Maturity”, “Reset Date”, “Period End Date”, “Spread”** and **“Floating Rate Day Count Fraction”** have the meanings given to those terms in the ISDA Definitions.

7.5 Screen Rate Determination

Where “Screen Rate Determination” is specified in the Pricing Supplement as the manner in which the Interest Rate is to be determined, the Interest Rate for each Interest Period is the sum of the Margin and the Screen Rate.

In this Condition 7.5, **“Screen Rate”** means, for an Interest Period, the quotation offered for the Reference Rate appearing on the Relevant Screen Page at the Relevant Time on the Interest Determination Date. However:

- (a) if there is more than one offered quotation displayed on the Relevant Screen Page at the Relevant Time on the Interest Determination Date, the **“Screen Rate”** means the rate calculated by the Calculation Agent as the average of the offered quotations. If there are more than five offered quotations, the Calculation Agent must exclude the highest and lowest quotations (or in the case of equality, one of the highest and one of the lowest quotations) from its calculation;
- (b) if an offered quotation is not displayed by the Relevant Time on the Interest Determination Date or if it is displayed but the Calculation Agent determines that there is an obvious error in that rate, the **“Screen Rate”** means:
 - (i) the rate the Calculation Agent calculates as the average mean of the Reference Rates that each Reference Bank quoted to the leading banks in the Relevant Financial Centre specified in the Pricing Supplement at the Relevant Time on the Interest Determination Date; or
 - (ii) where the Calculation Agent is unable to calculate a rate under paragraph (i) because it is unable to obtain at least two quotes, the rate the Calculation Agent calculates as the average of the rates (being the nearest equivalent to the Reference Rate) quoted by two or more banks as requested by the Issuer in the Relevant Financial Centre at approximately the Relevant Time on the Interest Determination Date for a period equivalent to the Interest Period to leading banks carrying on business in the Relevant Financial Centre in good faith; or
- (c) if the Pricing Supplement specifies an alternative method for the determination of the Screen Rate Determination, then that alternative method applies.

7.6 Benchmark Rate Determination

Where “Benchmark Rate Determination (BBSW Rate)” or “Benchmark Rate Determination (AONIA Rate)” is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as the manner in which the Interest Rate is to be determined for each Interest Period, the Interest Rate applicable to the Floating Rate Notes for each such Interest Period is the sum of the Margin and either (x) the BBSW Rate or (y) the AONIA Rate as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement.

Each Noteholder shall be deemed to acknowledge, accept and agree to be bound by, and consents to, the determination of, substitution for and any adjustments made to the BBSW Rate or the AONIA Rate, as applicable, in each case as described in this Condition 7.6 (in all cases without the need for any Noteholder consent). Any determination, decision or election (including a decision to take or refrain from taking any action or as to the occurrence or non-occurrence

of any event or circumstance), and any substitution for and adjustments made to, the BBSW Rate or the AONIA Rate, as applicable, and in each case made in accordance with this Condition 7.6, will, in the absence of manifest or proven error, be conclusive and binding on the Issuer, the Noteholder and each Agent and, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Conditions or other documentation relating to the Notes, shall become effective without the consent of any person.

If the Calculation Agent is unwilling or unable to determine a necessary rate, adjustment, quantum, formula, methodology or other variable in order to calculate the applicable Interest Rate, such rate, adjustment, quantum, formula, methodology or other variable will be determined by the Issuer (acting in good faith and in a commercially reasonable manner) or, an alternate financial institution (acting in good faith and in a commercially reasonable manner) appointed by the Issuer (in its sole discretion) to so determine.

All rates determined pursuant to this Condition 7.6 shall be expressed as a percentage rate per annum and the resulting percentage will be rounded if necessary to the fourth decimal place (i.e., to the nearest one ten-thousandth of a percentage point) with 0.00005 being rounded upwards.

However, if:

- (a) a Temporary Disruption Trigger has occurred; or
- (b) a Permanent Discontinuation Trigger has occurred,

then the “**Benchmark Rate**” for an Interest Period, whilst such Temporary Disruption Trigger is continuing or after a Permanent Discontinuation Trigger has occurred, means (in the following order of application and precedence):

- (i) where BBSW Rate is the Applicable Benchmark Rate, if a Temporary Disruption Trigger has occurred with respect to the BBSW Rate, in the following order of precedence:
 - (A) first, the Administrator Recommended Rate;
 - (B) then the Supervisor Recommended Rate; and
 - (C) lastly, the Final Fallback Rate;
- (ii) where AONIA Rate is the Applicable Benchmark Rate or a determination of the AONIA Rate is required for the purposes of paragraph (i) above, if a Temporary Disruption Trigger has occurred with respect to AONIA, the rate for any day for which AONIA is required will be the last provided or published level of AONIA;
- (iii) where a determination of the RBA Recommended Rate is required for the purposes of paragraph (i) or (ii) above, if a Temporary Disruption Trigger has occurred with respect to the RBA Recommended Rate, the rate for any day for which the RBA Recommended Rate is required will be the last rate provided or published by the Administrator of the RBA Recommended Rate (or if no such rate has been so provided or published, the last provided or published level of AONIA);
- (iv) where BBSW Rate is the Applicable Benchmark Rate, if a Permanent Discontinuation Trigger has occurred with respect to the BBSW Rate, the rate for any day for which the BBSW Rate is required on or after the Permanent Fallback Effective Date will be the first rate available in the following order of precedence:

- (A) first, if at the time of the BBSW Rate Permanent Fallback Effective Date, no AONIA Permanent Fallback Effective Date has occurred, the AONIA Rate;
 - (B) then, if at the time of the BBSW Rate Permanent Fallback Effective Date, an AONIA Permanent Fallback Effective Date has occurred, an RBA Recommended Rate has been created but no RBA Recommended Rate Permanent Fallback Effective Date has occurred, the RBA Recommended Fallback Rate; and
 - (C) lastly, if neither paragraph (A) nor paragraph (B) above apply, the Final Fallback Rate;
- (v) where AONIA Rate is the Applicable Benchmark Rate or a determination of the AONIA Rate is required for the purposes of paragraph (iv)(A) above, if a Permanent Discontinuation Trigger has occurred with respect to AONIA, the rate for any day for which AONIA is required on or after the AONIA Permanent Fallback Effective Date will be the first rate available in the following order of precedence:
- (A) first, if at the time of the AONIA Permanent Fallback Effective Date, an RBA Recommended Rate has been created but no RBA Recommended Rate Permanent Fallback Effective Date has occurred, the RBA Recommended Rate; and
 - (B) lastly, if paragraph (A) above does not apply, the Final Fallback Rate; and
- (c) where a determination of the RBA Recommended Rate is required for the purposes of paragraph (iv) or (v) above, respectively, if a Permanent Discontinuation Trigger has occurred with respect to the RBA Recommended Rate, the rate for any day for which the RBA Recommended Rate is required on or after that Permanent Fallback Effective Date will be the Final Fallback Rate.

When calculating an amount of interest in circumstances where a Fallback Rate other than the Final Fallback Rate applies, that interest will be calculated as if references to the BBSW Rate or AONIA Rate (as applicable) were references to that Fallback Rate. When calculating interest in circumstances where the Final Fallback Rate applies, the amount of interest will be calculated on the same basis as if the Applicable Benchmark Rate in effect immediately prior to the application of that Final Fallback Rate remained in effect but with necessary adjustments to substitute all references to that Applicable Benchmark Rate with corresponding references to the Final Fallback Rate.

For the purposes of this Condition 7.6:

Adjustment Spread means the adjustment spread as at the Adjustment Spread Fixing Date (which may be a positive or negative value or zero and determined pursuant to a formula or methodology) that is:

- (a) determined as the median of the historical differences between the BBSW Rate and AONIA over a five calendar year period prior to the Adjustment Spread Fixing Date using practices based on those used for the determination of the Bloomberg Adjustment Spread as at 1 December 2022, provided that for so long as the Bloomberg Adjustment Spread is published and determined based on the five year median of the historical differences between the BBSW Rate and AONIA, that adjustment spread will be deemed to be acceptable for the purposes of this paragraph (a); or
- (b) if no such median can be determined in accordance with paragraph (a), set using the method for calculating or determining such adjustment spread determined by the

Calculation Agent (after consultation with the Issuer where practicable) to be appropriate;

Adjustment Spread Fixing Date means the first date on which a Permanent Discontinuation Trigger occurs with respect to the BBSW Rate;

Administrator means:

- (a) in respect of the BBSW Rate, ASX Benchmarks Pty Limited (ABN 38 616 075 417);
- (b) in respect of AONIA (or where AONIA is used to determine an Applicable Benchmark Rate), the Reserve Bank of Australia; and
- (c) in respect of any other Applicable Benchmark Rate, the administrator for that rate or benchmark or, if there is no administrator, the provider of that rate or benchmark,

and, in each case, any successor administrator or, as applicable, any successor administrator or provider;

Administrator Recommended Rate means the rate formally recommended for use as the temporary replacement for the BBSW Rate by the Administrator of the BBSW Rate;

AONIA means the Australian dollar interbank overnight cash rate (known as AONIA);

AONIA Rate means, for an Interest Period and in respect of an Interest Determination Date, the rate determined by the Calculation Agent to be Compounded Daily AONIA for that Interest Period and Interest Determination Date plus, if determining the AONIA Rate for the purposes of a fallback from the BBSW Rate, the Adjustment Spread;

Applicable Benchmark Rate means the Benchmark Rate specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement and, if a Permanent Fallback Effective Date has occurred with respect to the BBSW Rate, AONIA or the RBA Recommended Rate, then the rate determined in accordance with this Condition 7.6;

BBSW Rate means, for an Interest Period, the rate for prime bank eligible securities having a tenor closest to the Interest Period which is designated as the "AVG MID" on the "Refinitiv Screen ASX29 Page" or the "MID" rate on the "Bloomberg Screen BBSW Page" (or any designation which replaces that designation on the applicable page, or any replacement page) at the Publication Time on the first day of that Interest Period;

Benchmark Rate means, for an Interest Period, either the BBSW Rate or the AONIA Rate as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

Bloomberg Adjustment Spread means the term adjusted AONIA spread relating to the BBSW Rate provided by Bloomberg Index Services Limited (or a successor provider as approved and/or appointed by ISDA from time to time as the provider of term adjusted AONIA and the spread) ("**BISL**") on the Fallback Rate (AONIA) Screen (or by other means), or provided to, and published by, authorised distributors where **Fallback Rate (AONIA) Screen** means the Bloomberg Screen corresponding to the Bloomberg ticker for the fallback for the BBSW Rate accessed via the Bloomberg Screen <FBAK> <GO> Page (or, if applicable, accessed via the Bloomberg Screen <HP> <GO>) or any other published source designated by BISL;

Compounded Daily AONIA means, with respect to an Interest Period, the rate of return of a daily compound interest investment as calculated by the Calculation Agent on the Interest Determination Date, as follows:

$$\left[\prod_{i=1}^{d_0} \left(1 + \frac{AONIA_{i-5\text{SBD}} \times n_i}{365} \right) - 1 \right] \times \frac{365}{d}$$

where:

$AONIA_{i-5SBD}$, means the per annum rate expressed as a decimal which is the level of AONIA provided by the Administrator and published as of the Publication Time for the Sydney Business Day falling five Sydney Business Days prior to such Sydney Business Day “i”;

d is the number of calendar days in the relevant Interest Period;

d_0 is the number of Sydney Business Days in the relevant Interest Period;

i is a series of whole numbers from 1 to d_0 , each representing the relevant Sydney Business Day in chronological order from (and including) the first Sydney Business Day in the relevant Interest Period to (and including) the last Sydney Business Day in such Interest Period;

n_i , for any Sydney Business Day “i”, means the number of calendar days from (and including) such Sydney Business Day “i” up to (but excluding) the following Sydney Business Day; and

Sydney Business Day or **SBD** means any day on which commercial banks are open for general business in Sydney.

If, for any reason, Compounded Daily AONIA needs to be determined for a period other than an Interest Period, Compounded Daily AONIA is to be determined as if that period were an Interest Period starting on (and including) the first day of that period and ending on (but excluding) the last day of that period;

Fallback Rate means, where a Permanent Discontinuation Trigger for an Applicable Benchmark Rate has occurred, the rate that applies to replace that Applicable Benchmark Rate in accordance with this Condition 7.6;

Final Fallback Rate means, in respect of an Applicable Benchmark Rate:

- (a) the rate determined by the Calculation Agent as a commercially reasonable alternative for the Applicable Benchmark Rate taking into account all available information that, in good faith, it considers relevant, provided that any rate (inclusive of any spreads or adjustments) implemented by central counterparties and / or futures exchanges with representative trade volumes in derivatives or futures referencing the Applicable Benchmark Rate will be deemed to be acceptable for the purposes of this paragraph (a), together with (without double counting) such adjustment spread (which may be a positive or negative value or zero) that is customarily applied to the relevant successor rate or alternative rate (as the case may be) in international debt capital markets transactions to produce an industry-accepted replacement rate for Benchmark Rate-linked floating rate notes at such time (together with such other adjustments to the Business Day Convention, interest determination dates and related provisions and definitions, in each case that are consistent with accepted market practice for the use of such successor rate or alternative rate for Benchmark Rate-linked floating rate notes at such time), or, if no such industry standard is recognised or acknowledged, the method for calculating or determining such adjustment spread determined by the Calculation Agent (in consultation with the Issuer) to be appropriate; provided that
- (b) if and for so long as no such successor rate or alternative rate can be determined in accordance with paragraph (a), the Final Fallback Rate will be the last provided or published level of that Applicable Benchmark Rate;

Interest Determination Date means, in respect of an Interest Period:

- (a) where the BBSW Rate applies or the Final Fallback Rate applies under paragraph (iv)(C) of this Condition 7.6, the first day of that Interest Period; and

- (b) otherwise, the third Business Day prior to the last day of that Interest Period;

Non-Representative means, in respect of an Applicable Benchmark Rate, that the Supervisor of that Applicable Benchmark Rate if the Applicable Benchmark Rate is the BBSW Rate, or the Administrator of the Applicable Benchmark Rate if the Applicable Benchmark Rate is the AONIA Rate or the RBA Recommended Rate:

- (a) has determined that such Applicable Benchmark Rate is no longer, or as of a specified future date will no longer be, representative of the underlying market and economic reality that such Applicable Benchmark Rate is intended to measure and that representativeness will not be restored; and
- (b) is aware that such determination will engage certain contractual triggers for fallbacks activated by pre-cessation announcements by such Supervisor (howsoever described) in contracts;

Permanent Discontinuation Trigger means, in respect of an Applicable Benchmark Rate:

- (a) a public statement or publication of information by or on behalf of the Administrator of the Applicable Benchmark Rate announcing that it has ceased or that it will cease to provide the Applicable Benchmark Rate permanently or indefinitely, provided that, at the time of the statement or publication, there is no successor administrator or provider, as applicable, that will continue to provide the Applicable Benchmark Rate and, in the case of the BBSW Rate, a public statement or publication of information by or on behalf of the Supervisor of the BBSW Rate has confirmed that cessation;
- (b) a public statement or publication of information by the Supervisor of the Applicable Benchmark Rate, the Reserve Bank of Australia (or any successor central bank for Australian dollars), an insolvency official or resolution authority with jurisdiction over the Administrator of the Applicable Benchmark Rate or a court or an entity with similar insolvency or resolution authority over the Administrator of the Applicable Benchmark Rate which states that the Administrator of the Applicable Benchmark Rate has ceased or will cease to provide the Applicable Benchmark Rate permanently or indefinitely, provided that, at the time of the statement or publication, there is no successor administrator or provider that will continue to provide the Applicable Benchmark Rate and, in the case of the BBSW Rate and a public statement or publication of information other than by the Supervisor, a public statement or publication of information by or on behalf of the Supervisor of the BBSW Rate has confirmed that cessation;
- (c) a public statement by the Supervisor of the Applicable Benchmark Rate if the Applicable Benchmark Rate is the BBSW Rate, or the Administrator of the Applicable Benchmark Rate if the Applicable Benchmark Rate is AONIA or the RBA Recommended Rate, as a consequence of which the Applicable Benchmark Rate will be prohibited from being used either generally, or in respect of the Notes, or that its use will be subject to restrictions or adverse consequences to the Issuer or a Noteholder;
- (d) as a consequence of a change in law or directive arising after the Issue Date of the first Tranche of Notes of a Series, it has become unlawful for the Calculation Agent, the Issuer or any other party responsible for calculations of interest under the Conditions to calculate any payments due to be made to any Noteholder using the Applicable Benchmark Rate;
- (e) a public statement or publication of information by the Supervisor of the Applicable Benchmark Rate if the Applicable Benchmark Rate is the BBSW Rate, or the Administrator of the Applicable Benchmark Rate if the Applicable Benchmark Rate is the AONIA Rate or the RBA Recommended Rate, stating that the Applicable Benchmark Rate is Non-Representative; or
- (f) the Applicable Benchmark Rate has otherwise ceased to exist or be administered on a permanent or indefinite basis;

Permanent Fallback Effective Date means, in respect of a Permanent Discontinuation Trigger for an Applicable Benchmark Rate:

- (a) in the case of paragraphs (a) and (b) of the definition of “Permanent Discontinuation Trigger”, the first date on which the Applicable Benchmark Rate would ordinarily have been published or provided and is no longer published or provided;
- (b) in the case of paragraphs (c) and (d) of the definition of “Permanent Discontinuation Trigger”, the date from which use of the Applicable Benchmark Rate is prohibited or becomes subject to restrictions or adverse consequences or the calculation becomes unlawful (as applicable);
- (c) in the case of paragraph (e) of the definition of “Permanent Discontinuation Trigger”, the first date on which the Applicable Benchmark Rate would ordinarily have been published or provided but is Non-Representative by reference to the most recent statement or publication contemplated in that paragraph and even if such Applicable Benchmark Rates continues to be published or provided on such date; or
- (d) in the case of paragraph (f) of the definition of “Permanent Discontinuation Trigger”, the date that event occurs;

Publication Time means:

- (a) in respect of the BBSW Rate, 12.00 noon (Sydney time) or any amended publication time for the final intraday refix of such rate specified by the Administrator for the BBSW Rate in its benchmark methodology; and
- (b) in respect of AONIA, 4.00 pm (Sydney time) or any amended publication time for the final intraday refix of such rate specified by the Administrator for AONIA in its benchmark methodology;

RBA Recommended Fallback Rate means, for an Interest Period and in respect of an Interest Determination Date, the rate determined by the Calculation Agent to be the RBA Recommended Rate for that Interest Period and Interest Determination Date;

RBA Recommended Rate means, in respect of any relevant day (including any day “i”), the rate (inclusive of any spreads or adjustments) recommended as the replacement for AONIA by the Reserve Bank of Australia (which rate may be produced by the Reserve Bank of Australia or another administrator) and as provided by the Administrator of that rate or, if that rate is not provided by the Administrator thereof, published by an authorised distributor in respect of that day;

Supervisor means, in respect of an Applicable Benchmark Rate, the supervisor or competent authority that is responsible for supervising that Applicable Benchmark Rate or the Administrator of that Applicable Benchmark Rate, or any committee officially endorsed or convened by any such supervisor or competent authority that is responsible for supervising that Applicable Benchmark Rate or the Administrator of that Applicable Benchmark Rate;

Supervisor Recommended Rate means the rate formally recommended for use as the temporary replacement for the BBSW Rate by the Supervisor of the BBSW Rate; and

Temporary Disruption Trigger means, in respect of any Applicable Benchmark Rate which is required for any determination:

- (a) the Applicable Benchmark Rate has not been published by the applicable Administrator or an authorised distributor and is not otherwise provided by the Administrator, in respect of, on, for or by the time and date on which that Applicable Benchmark Rate is required; or

- (b) the Applicable Benchmark Rate is published or provided but the Calculation Agent determines that there is an obvious or proven error in that rate.

7.7 Interpolation

If the Pricing Supplement states that “Linear Interpolation” applies to an Interest Period, the Interest Rate for that Interest Period is determined through the use of straight line interpolation by reference to two ISDA Rates, Screen Rates, BBSW Rates or other floating rates specified in the Pricing Supplement.

The first rate must be determined as if the Interest Period were the period of time for which rates are available next shorter than the length of the Interest Period (or any alternative Interest Period specified in the Pricing Supplement).

The second rate must be determined as if the Interest Period were the period of time for which rates are available next longer than the length of the Interest Period (or any alternative Interest Period specified in the Pricing Supplement).

8 General provisions applicable to interest

8.1 Maximum or Minimum Interest Rate

If the Pricing Supplement specifies a “Maximum Interest Rate” or “Minimum Interest Rate” for any Interest Period, the Interest Rate for the Interest Period must not be greater than the maximum, or be less than the minimum, so specified. If no rate is specified, the Minimum Interest Rate shall be zero.

8.2 Calculation of Interest Rate and interest payable

- (a) The Calculation Agent must, in relation to each Interest Period for each Floating Rate Note:
 - (i) calculate the Interest Rate in accordance with these Conditions and the Pricing Supplement; and
 - (ii) as soon as practicable after determining the Interest Rate, calculate the amount of interest payable for the Interest Period in respect of the outstanding principal amount of that Note.
- (b) Unless otherwise specified in the Pricing Supplement, the amount of interest payable is calculated by multiplying the product of the Interest Rate for the Interest Period and the outstanding principal amount of the Note by the applicable Day Count Fraction.
- (c) The rate determined by the Calculation Agent must be expressed as a percentage rate per annum.

8.3 Calculation of other amounts

If the Pricing Supplement specifies that any other amount is to be calculated by the Calculation Agent, the Calculation Agent must, as soon as practicable after the time at which that amount is to be determined, calculate the amount in the manner specified in the Pricing Supplement.

8.4 Notification of Interest Rate, interest payable and other items

- (a) The Calculation Agent must notify the Issuer, the Registrar, the Noteholders and each other Agent and, to the extent required by the relevant rules of any stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed, quoted and/or traded, the Issuer will notify any stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed, quoted and/or traded, of:

- (i) each Interest Rate, the amount of interest payable and each other amount, item or date calculated or determined by it together with the Interest Payment Date, if required by any applicable law, directive or requirement of any stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed, quoted and/or traded; and
 - (ii) any amendment to any amount, item or date referred to in paragraph (i) arising from any extension or reduction in any Interest Period or calculation period.
- (b) The Calculation Agent must give notice under this Condition as soon as practicable after it makes its determination. However, it must give notice of each Interest Rate, the amount of interest payable and each Interest Payment Date by the fourth day of the Interest Period.
 - (c) The Calculation Agent may amend its determination of any amount, item or date (or make appropriate alternative arrangements by way of adjustment) as a result of the extension or reduction of the Interest Period or calculation period without prior notice but must notify the Issuer, the Registrar, the Noteholders and each other Agent after doing so. The Issuer will notify each stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed, quoted and/or traded after the Calculation Agent has made any such amendment if required to do so.

8.5 Determination final

The determination by the Calculation Agent of all amounts, rates and dates falling to be determined by it under these Conditions is, in the absence of manifest or proven error, final and binding on the Issuer, the Registrar, each Noteholder and each other Agent.

8.6 Rounding

For the purposes of any calculations required under these Conditions (unless otherwise specified in these Conditions or in the Pricing Supplement):

- (a) all percentages resulting from those calculations must be rounded, if necessary, to the nearest one hundred-thousandth of a percentage point (with 0.000005% being rounded up to 0.00001%);
- (b) all figures resulting from those calculations must be rounded to five decimal places (with 0.000005 being rounded up to 0.00001); and
- (c) all amounts that are due and payable must be rounded (with halves being rounded up) to:
 - (i) in the case of Australian dollars, one cent; and
 - (ii) in the case of any other currency, the lowest amount of that currency available as legal tender in the country of that currency.

9 Redemption and purchase

9.1 Redemption on maturity

Each Note is redeemable by the Issuer on the Maturity Date at its Redemption Amount unless:

- (a) the Note has been previously redeemed;
- (b) the Note has been purchased and cancelled;
- (c) the Pricing Supplement states that the Note has no fixed Maturity Date; or

- (d) the Note (or a portion of it) has been the subject of an exercise of the Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers and otherwise been redeemed, cancelled or converted.

9.2 Partly paid Notes

Each Partly Paid Note is redeemable on the Maturity Date in accordance with the Conditions and Pricing Supplement.

9.3 Early redemption for taxation reasons

Subject to Condition 9.7 (“Restrictions on early redemption”), the Issuer may redeem all (but not some) of the Notes of a Series in whole before their Maturity Date at the Redemption Amount and any interest accrued and unpaid on it to (but excluding) the Redemption Date if, as a result of a Tax Law Change:

- (a) the Issuer has or will become obliged to pay Additional Amounts on the occasion of the next payment due in respect of the Notes; or
- (b) the Issuer is or will no longer be entitled to claim a deduction in respect of any payments in respect of the Notes in computing its taxation liabilities or the amount of such deduction is or will be materially reduced on the occasion of the next payment due in respect of such Notes,

and, in either case, the foregoing cannot be avoided by the Issuer taking reasonable measures available to it.

However, the Issuer may only do so if:

- (i) prior to the publication of any notice of redemption for taxation reasons, the Issuer shall deliver to the Registrar a certificate signed by two duly authorised officers of the Issuer stating that the Issuer is entitled to effect such redemption for taxation reasons and setting forth a statement of facts showing that the conditions precedent to the right of the Issuer so to redeem have occurred and an opinion of independent legal (or tax or accounting) advisers of recognised standing to the effect that the Issuer has or will become obliged to pay such Additional Amounts or, as applicable, that payments are or will no longer be deductible as aforesaid or the amount of such deduction is or will be materially reduced, in each case as a result of such change or amendment;
- (ii) the Issuer has given at least 15 days’ and no more than 30 days’ (or any other period specified in the Pricing Supplement) notice to the Registrar, the Noteholders, each other Agent and any stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed, quoted and/or traded; and
- (iii) in the case of Floating Rate Notes:
 - (A) the proposed Redemption Date is an Interest Payment Date; and
 - (B) the notice of redemption is given at least 90 days prior to the earliest date on which the Issuer would be obliged to pay Additional Amounts were a payment in respect of the Notes then due or, as applicable, a payment in respect of the Notes would no longer be deductible or the amount of such deduction would be materially reduced were a payment in respect of the Notes then due.

For the purposes of this Condition 9.3, “**Tax Law Change**” means any change in or amendment to the laws or directives of the Republic of Finland or of any political subdivision thereof or any authority or agency therein or thereof having power to tax, or in the interpretation or administration of any such laws or directives which becomes effective on or after the Issue Date of the first Tranche of the relevant Series of Notes.

9.4 Early redemption at the option of the Issuer (Issuer call)

Subject to Condition 9.7 (“Restrictions on early redemption”) and if the relevant Pricing Supplement states that the Issuer may redeem all or some of the Notes of a Series before their Maturity Date under this Condition, the Issuer may redeem so many of the Notes specified in the Pricing Supplement at the Redemption Amount and any interest accrued and unpaid on it to (but excluding) the Redemption Date.

However, the Issuer may only do so if:

- (a) the amount of Notes to be redeemed is, or is a multiple of, their Denomination;
- (b) the Issuer has given not less than 15 days’ and no more than 30 days’ (or any other period specified in the Pricing Supplement) notice to the Registrar, the Noteholders, each other Agent and any stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed;
- (c) the proposed Redemption Date is an “Early Redemption Date (Call)” specified in the Pricing Supplement; and
- (d) any other relevant condition specified in the Pricing Supplement is satisfied.

9.5 Clean-Up Call

Subject to Condition 9.7 (“Restrictions on early redemption”) and if the relevant Pricing Supplement states that the Issuer may redeem all or some of the Notes of a Series before their Maturity Date under this Condition, the Issuer may redeem so many of the Notes specified in the Pricing Supplement at the Redemption Amount and any interest accrued and unpaid on it to (but excluding) the Redemption Date.

However, the Issuer may only do so if:

- (a) if the outstanding aggregate principal amount of the Notes in a Series is 20% (or such other amount as is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement) or less of the aggregate principal amount of the Notes of the Series originally issued (and, for these purposes, any further Notes issued pursuant to Condition 18 (“Further issues”) and consolidated with the Notes as part of the same Series shall be deemed to have been originally issued) (the “**Clean-Up Call Threshold**”);
- (b) the Issuer delivers to the Registrar and the Noteholders a certificate signed by two duly authorised officers of the Issuer which shall specify that the Issuer is entitled to effect such redemption and setting forth a statement of facts showing that the outstanding aggregate principal amount of the Notes of the Series is equal to or less than the Clean-up Call Threshold;
- (c) the Issuer has given not less than 15 days’ and no more than 30 days’ (or any other period specified in the Pricing Supplement) notice to the Registrar, the Noteholders, each other Agent and any stock exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed; and
- (d) any other relevant condition specified in the Pricing Supplement is satisfied.

9.6 Early redemption as a result of an MREL Disqualification Event

Subject to Condition 9.7 (“Restrictions on early redemption”), if the Pricing Supplement states that this Condition 9.6 is applicable to an issue of Notes, then if an MREL Disqualification Event occurs the Issuer may, at its option, redeem all (but not some) of the Notes before their Maturity Date at the Redemption Amount and any interest accrued and unpaid on it to (but excluding) the Redemption Date.

However, the Issuer may only do so if:

- (a) the Issuer delivers to the Registrar and the Noteholders a certificate signed by two duly authorised officers of the Issuer which shall specify:
 - (i) that an MREL Disqualification Event has occurred and is continuing; and
 - (ii) that the Issuer has obtained the prior written consent of the Resolution Authority, provided that at the relevant time such consent is required to be given; and
- (b) the Issuer has given at least 30 days' and no more than 60 days' notice to the Registrar, the Noteholders, each other Agent and any stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed, quoted and/or traded;

Any refusal by the Resolution Authority to grant its approval as described above will not constitute an event of default under the Notes.

9.7 Restrictions on early redemption

The Issuer may redeem or purchase any Notes in accordance with the terms of Conditions 9.3 ("Early redemption for taxation reasons"), 9.4 ("Early redemption at the option of the Issuer (Issuer call)"), 9.5 ("Clean-Up Call"), 9.6 ("Early redemption as a result of an MREL Disqualification Event") or 9.11 ("Purchase") (and give notice thereof to the Noteholders) only if such redemption or purchase is in accordance with the Applicable Banking Regulations and (if required by the Applicable Banking Regulations at the relevant time) it has been granted the approval of or permission from the Resolution Authority and:

- (a) before or at the same time as such redemption or repurchase of any Notes, the Issuer replaces such Notes with own funds instruments or eligible liabilities instruments of an equal or higher quality at terms that are sustainable for its income capacity; or
- (b) the Issuer has demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Resolution Authority that its own funds and eligible liabilities would, following such redemption or repurchase, exceed the requirements for own funds and eligible liabilities under CRD and BRRD by a margin that the Resolution Authority, in agreement with the Competent Authority, considers necessary; or
- (c) the Issuer has demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Resolution Authority that the partial or full replacement of the eligible liabilities with own funds instruments is necessary to ensure compliance with the own funds requirements laid down in the CRD for continuing authorisation.

Any refusal by the Resolution Authority to grant its approval or permission as described above will not constitute an event of default under the relevant Notes.

9.8 Partial redemptions

If only some of the Notes are to be redeemed under Condition 9.4 ("Early redemption at the option of the Issuer (Issuer call)"), the Notes to be redeemed must be specified in the notice and selected:

- (a) in a fair and reasonable manner under the circumstances of the proposed redemption and having regard to prevailing market practice; and
- (b) in compliance with any applicable law, directive or requirement of any applicable Clearing System and stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed.

9.9 Effect of notice of redemption

Any notice of redemption given by the Issuer or a Noteholder under this Condition 9 is irrevocable.

9.10 Late payment

If an amount is not paid under this Condition 9 when due, then:

- (a) for a Note (other than a Zero Coupon Note), interest continues to accrue on the unpaid amount (both before and after any demand or judgment) at the default rate specified in the Pricing Supplement (or, if no default rate is specified, the last applicable Interest Rate) until the date on which payment is made to the Noteholder; and
- (b) for a Zero Coupon Note, the obligation to pay the amount is replaced by an obligation to pay the Amortised Face Amount recalculated as at the date on which payment is made to the Noteholder.

9.11 Purchase

Subject to Condition 9.7 ("Restrictions on early redemption"), the Issuer may at any time purchase Notes in the open market or otherwise and at any price. Such Notes may be held, reissued, resold, or at the option of such purchaser, cancelled by notice to the Registrar. Purchases may be made by tender offers or in any other manner at the discretion of the purchasers, in each case, subject to compliance with any applicable law, directive or requirement of any stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed.

10 Payments

10.1 Payment of principal

Payments of principal in respect of a Note will be made to each person registered at 10.00 am on the payment date as the Noteholder of that Note (or the first person to be registered in the case of joint holders).

10.2 Payment of interest

Payments of interest in respect of a Note will be made to each person registered at the close of business on the Record Date as the Noteholder of that Note (or the first person to be registered in the case of joint holders).

10.3 Payments to accounts

Payments in respect of the Note will be made in Australia, unless prohibited by law, and:

- (a) if the Note is held in the Austraclear System, by crediting on the payment date, the amount due to:
 - (i) the account of Austraclear (as the Noteholder) in Australia previously notified to the Issuer and the Registrar; or
 - (ii) if requested by Austraclear, the accounts in Australia of the persons in whose Security Record a Note is recorded as previously notified by Austraclear to the Issuer and the Registrar in accordance with Austraclear Regulations; and
- (b) if the Note is not held in the Austraclear System, by crediting on the payment date, the amount then due under each Note to an account in Australia previously notified by the Noteholder to the Issuer and the Registrar.

If a payment in respect of the Note is prohibited by law from being made in Australia, such payment will be made in an international financial centre for the account of the relevant payee, and on the basis that the relevant amounts are paid in immediately available funds, freely transferable at the order of the payee.

10.4 Other payments

If the Noteholder has not notified the Registrar of an account to which payments to it must be made by the close of business on the Record Date, payments in respect of the Note will be made in the relevant jurisdiction or financial centre for the currency in which the payment is made in such manner as the Issuer may determine in its sole discretion and in no such circumstances will the Issuer be responsible for, nor will the Noteholder be entitled to, any additional payments for any delay in payment where the Noteholder has not notified the Registrar of an account for payment.

10.5 Payments subject to law

All payments are subject in all cases to:

- (a) any applicable fiscal or other laws and directives in any jurisdiction but without prejudice to the provisions of Condition 11 ("Taxation"); and
- (b) any withholding or deduction required pursuant to an agreement described in Section 1471(b) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or otherwise imposed pursuant to Sections 1471 through 1474 of that Code, any regulations or agreements thereunder, official interpretations thereof, or (but without prejudice to the provisions of Condition 11 ("Taxation")) any law implementing an intergovernmental approach thereto.

10.6 Payments on Business Days

If a payment is due on a day which is not a Business Day then the due date for payment is adjusted in accordance with the applicable Business Day Convention. The Noteholder is not entitled to any additional payment in respect of such delay.

10.7 Currency indemnity

The Issuer waives any right it has in any jurisdiction to pay an amount other than in the currency in which it is due. However, if a Noteholder receives an amount in a currency other than that in which it is due:

- (a) it may convert the amount received into the due currency (even though it may be necessary to convert through a third currency to do so) on the day and at such rates (including spot rate, same day value rate or value tomorrow rate) as it reasonably considers appropriate. It may deduct its usual costs in connection with the conversion; and
- (b) the Issuer satisfies its obligation to pay in the due currency only to the extent of the amount of the due currency obtained from the conversion after deducting the costs of the conversion.

11 Taxation

11.1 No set-off, counterclaim or deductions

All payments of principal and interest in respect of the Notes by the Issuer will be made without withholding or deduction for or on account of any present or future Taxes unless such withholding or deduction is required by law.

11.2 Withholding tax

Subject to Condition 11.3 ("Withholding tax exemptions"), if a law requires the Issuer to withhold or deduct an amount in respect of Taxes from a payment in respect of the Notes such that the Noteholder would not actually receive on the due date the full amount provided for under the Notes, then:

- (a) the Issuer agrees to deduct the amount for the Taxes (and any further withholding or deduction applicable to any further payment due under paragraph (b) below); and
- (b) if the amount deducted or withheld is in respect of Taxes imposed by the Republic of Finland or any political subdivision thereof or any authority therein or thereof having power to tax, the Issuer will pay such additional amounts so that, after making the deduction and further deductions applicable to additional amounts payable under the Conditions in respect of interest on the Notes, each Noteholder is entitled to receive (at the time of payment is due) the amount it would have received if no deductions or withholdings had been required to be made in respect of interest on the Notes.

11.3 Withholding tax exemptions

No Additional Amounts shall be payable under Condition 11.2 ("Withholding tax") with respect to any Note:

- (a) presented for payment by, or by a third party on behalf of, the Noteholder who is liable for such Taxes in respect of such Note by reason of having his having some connection with the Republic of Finland other than the mere holding of the Note;
- (b) presented for payment more than 30 days after the Relevant Date, except to the extent that the relevant Noteholder would have been entitled to such Additional Amounts on presenting the same for payment on the expiry of such thirtieth day; or
- (c) to, or to a third party on behalf of, a Noteholder who would not be liable or subject to such withholding or deduction if he were to make a declaration of non-residence or other claim for exemption but fails to do so.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Conditions, any amounts to be paid on the Notes by or on behalf of the Issuer will be paid net of any deduction or withholding imposed or required pursuant to an agreement described in Section 1471(b) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "**Code**"), or otherwise imposed pursuant to Sections 1471 through 1474 of the Code (or any regulations thereunder or official interpretations thereof) or an intergovernmental agreement between the United States and another jurisdiction facilitating the implementation thereof (or any fiscal or regulatory legislation, rules or practices implementing such an intergovernmental agreement) (any such withholding or deduction, a "**FATCA Withholding**"). Neither the Issuer nor any other person will be required to pay any additional amounts in respect of FATCA Withholding.

12 Time limit for claims

A claim against the Issuer for a payment under a Note is void unless made within three years from the date on which payment first became due.

13 Events of Default

For the avoidance of doubt, a resolution of the Issuer or any moratorium in respect of the Issuer or any exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Competent Authority and/or the Resolution Authority will not constitute an enforcement event or a breach of the Issuer's obligations or duties in respect of the Notes, or a failure to perform any of the Issuer's obligations or duties in respect of the Notes in any manner whatsoever, and shall not, of itself, entitle Noteholders to petition for the winding up or liquidation of the Issuer.

13.1 Events of Default

Any of the following events will constitute an Event of Default in respect of the Notes:

- (a) **(non-payment of principal)** if there is a default in the payment of any principal or other redemption amount due in respect of the Notes for more than 15 Business Days;
- (b) **(non-payment of interest)** if there is a default in the payment of interest in respect of the Notes as and when the same becomes due and payable for more than 15 Business Days; or
- (c) **(winding up)** if an order is made or an effective resolution is passed for the winding-up or liquidation (otherwise than in connection with a Permitted Reorganisation) or bankruptcy of the Issuer in the Republic of Finland.

If an Event of Default occurs and is continuing in respect of any Series of Notes:

- (i) in the case of an Event of Default described at paragraphs (a) or (b) above, any Noteholder may, subject as provided below, at its discretion institute proceedings in the Republic of Finland for the winding-up or bankruptcy of the Issuer (provided that such steps are available for a creditor under applicable law) and prove or claim in the bankruptcy or liquidation of the Issuer but subject to such Noteholder only being able to claim payment in respect of the Notes in the winding-up or liquidation, as the case may be, of the Issuer; or
- (ii) in the case of an Event of Default described at paragraph (c) above, any Noteholder may, subject as provided below, at its discretion give written notice to the Issuer that such Note is, and it shall accordingly thereby immediately become, due and repayable at its Redemption Amount, together with accrued interest (if any) thereon but subject to such Note only becoming due and payable, and to each Noteholder only being able to claim payment in respect of the Notes in the winding-up or liquidation, as the case may be, of the Issuer.

The Noteholder may at its discretion institute such proceedings against the Issuer as it may think fit to enforce any obligation, condition, undertaking or provision binding on the Issuer under the Notes (other than, without prejudice to paragraphs (i) and (ii) above, any obligation for the payment of any principal or interest in respect of the Notes) provided that the Issuer shall not by virtue of the institution of any such proceedings be obliged to pay any sum or sums sooner than the same would otherwise have been payable by it, except with the prior approval of the Resolution Authority. Any refusal by the Resolution Authority to grant its approval as described above will not constitute an event of default under the Notes.

Any notice declaring the Notes due under this Condition 13.1 shall become effective only when the Issuer has received such notices from the Noteholders of at least one-fifth in principal amount of the relevant Notes then outstanding.

13.2 Notification

If an Event of Default occurs, the Issuer must promptly after becoming aware of it notify the Registrar of the occurrence of the event (specifying details of it) and use its reasonable endeavours to ensure that the Registrar promptly notifies the Noteholders, each other Agent and any stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed, quoted and/or traded of the occurrence of the event.

14 Agents

14.1 Role of Agents

In acting under an Agency Agreement, each Agent acts solely as agent of the Issuer and does not assume any obligations towards or relationship of agency or trust for or with any Noteholder.

14.2 Appointment and replacement of Agents

Each initial Agent for a Series of Notes is specified in the Pricing Supplement. Subject to Condition 14.4 (“Required Agents”), the Issuer reserves the right at any time to vary or terminate the appointment of any Agent and to appoint a successor.

14.3 Change of Agent

Notice of any change of an Agent or its Specified Offices must promptly be given to the Noteholders by the Issuer or the Agent on its behalf.

14.4 Required Agents

The Issuer must, in respect of each Series of Notes:

- (a) at all times maintain a Registrar; and
- (b) if a Calculation Agent is specified in the Pricing Supplement, at all times maintain a Calculation Agent.

14.5 Liability of Agents with respect to the Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers

Each Noteholder:

- (a) expressly waives any and all claims against each Agent for, and agrees not to initiate a suit against an Agent in respect of, and agrees that no Agent shall be liable for, any action that an Agent takes, or abstains from taking, in either case in accordance with an exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Resolution Authority with respect to the Notes;
- (b) acknowledges and agrees that no Agent shall be under any duty to determine, monitor or report on whether there has been an exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Resolution Authority or to determine or calculate, or verify any determination or calculation of, or relating to, an exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers; and
- (c) shall be deemed to have authorised, directed and requested each Agent, as applicable, to take any and all necessary action to give effect to the exercise of any Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers by the Resolution Authority without any further action or direction on the part of a Noteholder.

For the purposes of this Condition 14.5, a reference to “**Noteholders**” includes any person holding an interest in the Notes.

15 Meetings of Noteholders

The Meeting Provisions contain provisions (which have effect as if incorporated in these Conditions) for convening meetings of the Noteholders of any Series to consider any matter affecting their interests, including any variation of these Conditions.

16 Substitution or Variation following an MREL Disqualification Event

If this Condition 16 is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being applicable, then if an MREL Disqualification Event has occurred and is continuing, or to ensure the effectiveness or enforceability of Condition 4.5 (“Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers”), the Issuer may, upon the expiry of the appropriate notice and subject to the other provisions of this Condition 16 (without any requirement for the consent or approval of the Noteholders) either substitute all (but not some only) of the Notes for, or vary the terms of the Notes so that they remain or, as appropriate, become, Compliant Instruments, provided that, in each case:

- (a) such variation or substitution does not itself give rise to any right of the Issuer to redeem the varied or substituted securities;
- (b) such variation or substitution would not itself directly lead to a downgrade in any of the credit ratings solicited by the Issuer of the Notes as assigned to such Notes by any Rating Agency immediately prior to such variation or substitution (unless any such downgrade is solely attributable to the effectiveness and enforceability of Condition 4.5 (“Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers”)); and
- (c) such variation or substitution is not materially less favourable to Noteholders of the relevant Notes (unless any such prejudice is solely attributable to the effectiveness and enforceability of Condition 4.5 (“Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers”)).

For the avoidance of doubt, any such substitution or variation shall not be deemed to be a modification or amendment for the purposes of Condition 17 (“Variation”).

Any substitution or variation in accordance with this Condition 16 is subject to the Issuer obtaining prior written consent of the Resolution Authority and complying with any Applicable Banking Regulations and the rules of any stock or securities exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are listed, quoted and/or traded.

Any refusal by the Resolution Authority to grant its approval as described above will not constitute an event of default under the relevant Notes.

The appropriate notice referred to in this Condition 16 is a notice given by the Issuer to the Registrar and the Noteholders of the Notes, which notice shall be irrevocable, shall be signed by two duly authorised officers of the Issuer and shall specify:

- (i) that an MREL Disqualification Event has occurred and is continuing or (as the case may be) the substitution or variation is, in the opinion of the Issuer, considered necessary to ensure the effectiveness or enforceability of Condition 4.5 (“Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers”);
- (ii) that (if applicable) the Issuer has obtained the prior written consent of the Resolution Authority, provided that at the relevant time such consent is required to be given;
- (iii) that, in the opinion of the Issuer, the substituted or varied Notes will have terms not materially less favourable to an investor than the terms of the Notes (unless any such prejudice is solely attributable to the effectiveness and enforceability of Condition 4.5 (“Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers”)); and
- (iv) the due date for such substitution or variation, which shall be not less than 30 nor more than 60 days after the date on which such notice is validly given.

17 Variation

17.1 Variation with consent

Unless Condition 17.2 (“Variation without consent”) applies, any Condition may be varied by the Issuer in accordance with the Meeting Provisions.

17.2 Variation without consent

Any Condition may be amended by the Issuer without the consent of the Noteholders if the amendment:

- (a) is made to give effect to any successor rate or alternative rate for the BBSW Rate or AONIA Rate as provided in Condition 7.6 (“Benchmark Rate Determination”);
- (b) is of a formal, minor or technical nature;
- (c) is made to correct a manifest or proven error;
- (d) is made to cure any ambiguity or correct or supplement any defective or inconsistent provision and, in the reasonable opinion of the Issuer, is not materially prejudicial to the interests of the Noteholders;
- (e) is to comply with mandatory provisions of the law of the jurisdiction in which the Issuer is incorporated; or
- (f) only applies to Notes issued by it after the date of amendment.

18 Further issues

The Issuer may from time to time, without the consent of the Noteholders, create and issue further Notes having the same Conditions as the Notes of any Series in all respects (or in all respects except for the Issue Price, Issue Date and the first Interest Payment Date) so as to form a single series with the Notes of that Series.

19 Notices

19.1 To Noteholders

All notices and other communications to Noteholders must be in writing. Any such notice or other communication may be given by any of the following means:

- (a) an advertisement published in the *Australian Financial Review* or *The Australian*;
- (b) if the Pricing Supplement specifies an additional or alternate newspaper, given by an advertisement published in that newspaper; or
- (c) prepaid post (airmail, if posted from a place outside Australia) to the address, as the case may be, of the Noteholder as shown in the Register at the close of business three Business Days prior to the dispatch of the notice or communication).

In addition, for so long as Notes are held on behalf of a Clearing System, notices or communications to Noteholders may also be given by delivery to that Clearing System for communication by it to the Noteholders in accordance with the applicable rules and regulations of that Clearing System (including, in the case of the Austraclear System, the Austraclear Regulations). Any such communication shall be deemed to have been given to the Noteholders on the day on which the said notice was given to the relevant Clearing System.

19.2 To the Issuer and the Agents

All notices and other communications to the Issuer or an Agent must be in writing and may be left at the address of, or sent by prepaid post (airmail, if appropriate) to, its respective Specified Office or by email to the email address of the addressee specified:

- (a) in the Information Memorandum; or
- (b) as otherwise agreed between those parties from time to time and notified to the Noteholders.

19.3 Effective on receipt

Unless a later time is specified in it a notice, approval, consent or other communication takes effect from the time it is received under Condition 19.4 (“Proof of receipt”), except that if it is received under that Condition after 5.00 pm in the place of receipt or on a non-Business Day in that place, it is to be taken to be received at 9.00 am on the next succeeding Business Day in that place.

19.4 Proof of receipt

Subject to Condition 19.3 (“Effective on receipt”), proof of posting a letter, sending of an email or publication of a notice is proof of receipt:

- (a) in the case of a letter, on the third (seventh if outside Australia) day after posting;
- (b) in the case of an email, at the time the sender receives an automated message confirming delivery or four hours after the time sent (as recorded on the device from which the sender sent the email) unless the sender receives an automated message that the email has not been delivered; and
- (c) in the case of publication in a newspaper, on the date of such publication.

20 Governing law, jurisdiction and service of process

20.1 Governing law

The Notes are governed by, and construed in accordance with, the law in force in New South Wales, Australia, except that the provisions in Conditions 4.1 (“Status and ranking – Senior Preferred Notes”), 4.2 (“Status and ranking – Senior Non-Preferred Notes”) and 4.5 (“Acknowledgement of Bail-in and Loss Absorption Powers”) and any non-contractual obligations arising out of or in connection with them are governed by Finnish law.

20.2 Jurisdiction

The Issuer irrevocably and unconditionally submits, and each Noteholder is taken to have submitted, to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of New South Wales and courts of appeal from them. 20.3 Serving documents

Without preventing any other method of service, any document in any Proceedings may be served on the Issuer by being delivered or left with its process agent referred to in Condition 20.4 (“Agent for service of process”).

20.4 Agent for service of process

Selling Restrictions

Under the Amended and Restated Dealer Agreement dated 27 March 2024 between the Issuer, the Arranger and the Dealer (as amended and supplemented from time to time, the “Dealer Agreement”) and subject to the Conditions contained in the Information Memorandum, the Notes will be offered by the Issuer through a Dealer. - (b) the expression an “**offer**” includes the communication in any form and by any means of sufficient information on the terms of the offer and the Notes to be offered so as to enable an investor to decide to purchase or subscribe for the Notes.

Other UK regulatory restrictions

*“The Notes covered hereby have not been and will not be registered under the U.S. Securities Act of 1933, as amended (the “**Securities Act**”), and may not be offered or sold within the United States or to, or for the account or benefit of, U.S. persons (i) as part of such Dealer’s distribution at any time or (ii) otherwise until 40 days after the completion of the distribution of the Tranche of Notes of which such Notes are a part, except in either case in accordance with Rule 903 of Regulation S under the Securities Act. Terms used above have the meanings given to them by Regulation S.”*

Until 40 days after the completion of the distribution of all Notes of the Tranche of which those Notes are a part, an offer or sale of Notes within the United States of America by any Dealer acting in relation to that Tranche or other distributor (whether or not participating in the offering) may violate the registration requirements of the Securities Act if such offer or sale is made otherwise than in accordance with an applicable exemption from registration under the Securities Act.

6 Hong Kong

Each Dealer has represented and agreed, and each further Dealer appointed under the Programme will be required to represent and agree, that unless an applicable Pricing Supplement (or another supplement to this Information Memorandum) otherwise provides:

- (a) it has not offered or sold, and will not offer or sell, in Hong Kong, by means of any document, any Notes other than:
 - (i) to “professional investors” as defined in the Securities and Futures Ordinance (Cap. 571) (as amended) of Hong Kong (“**SFO**”) and any rules made under the SFO; or
 - (ii) in other circumstances which do not result in the document being a “prospectus” as defined in the Companies (Winding Up and Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance (Cap. 32) of Hong Kong (as amended) (“**C(WUMPO)**”) or which do not constitute an offer to the public within the meaning of the C(WUMPO); and
- (b) it has not issued, or had in its possession for the purposes of issue, and will not issue, or have in its possession for the purposes of issue, (in each case, whether in Hong Kong or elsewhere) any advertisement, invitation, other offering material or other document relating to the Notes, which is directed at, or the contents of which are likely to be accessed or read by, the public in Hong Kong (except if permitted to do so under the securities laws of Hong Kong) other than with respect to Notes which are or are

intended to be disposed of only to persons outside Hong Kong or only to “professional investors” as defined in the SFO and any rules made under the SFO.

7 Japan

The Notes have not been and will not be registered under the Financial Instruments and Exchange Act of Japan (Act No. 25 of 1948, as amended, the “**Financial Instruments and Exchange Act**”) and, accordingly, each Dealer has represented and agreed that, and each further Dealer appointed under the Programme will be required to represent and agree, that it has not, directly or indirectly, offered or sold, and will not, directly or indirectly, offer or sell, any Notes directly or indirectly in Japan or to, or for the benefit of, any resident of Japan or to others for re-offering or resale, directly or indirectly, in Japan or to, any resident of Japan except pursuant to an exemption from the registration requirements of, and otherwise in compliance with, the Financial Instruments and Exchange Act and other relevant laws and regulations of Japan. As used in this paragraph, “**resident of Japan**” means any person resident in Japan, including any corporation or other entity organised under the laws of Japan.

8 Singapore

Each Dealer has acknowledged, and each further Dealer appointed under the Programme will be required to acknowledge that it understands, that this Information Memorandum has not been registered as a prospectus with the Monetary Authority of Singapore.

Accordingly, each Dealer has represented, warranted and agreed, and each further Dealer appointed under the Programme will be required to represent, warrant and agree, that it has not offered or sold any Notes or caused the Notes to be made the subject of an invitation for subscription or purchase and will not offer or sell any Notes or cause the Notes to be made the subject of an invitation for subscription or purchase, and has not circulated or distributed, nor will it circulate or distribute this Information Memorandum or any other document or material in connection with the offer or sale, or invitation for subscription or purchase, of the Notes, whether directly or indirectly, to any persons in Singapore other than:

- (a) to an institutional investor (as defined in Section 4A of the Securities and Futures Act, 2001 of Singapore (as modified or amended) (the “**SFA**”) pursuant to Section 274 of the SFA; or
- (b) to an accredited investor (as defined in Section 4A of the SFA) pursuant to and in accordance with the conditions specified in Section 275 of the SFA.

9 European Economic Area

9.1 Prohibition of sales to EEA retail investors

Each Dealer has represented and agreed, and each further Dealer appointed under the Programme will be required to represent and agree, that it has not offered, sold or otherwise made available and will not offer, sell or otherwise make available such Notes to any retail investor in the European Economic Area. For the purposes of this provision:

- (a) the expression “**retail investor**” means a person who is one (or more) of the following:
 - (i) a retail client as defined in point (11) of Article 4(1) of Directive 2014/65/EU (as amended, “**MiFID II**”); or
 - (ii) a customer within the meaning of Directive (EU) 2016/97, where that customer would not qualify as a professional client as defined in point (10) of Article 4(1) of MiFID II; or

- (iii) not a qualified investor as defined in Regulation (EU) 2017/1129; and
- (b) the expression “**offer**” includes the communication in any form and by any means of sufficient information on the terms of the offer and the Notes to be offered so as to enable an investor to decide to purchase or subscribe for the Notes.

10 Variation

These selling restrictions may be amended, varied, replaced or otherwise updated from time to time in accordance with the Dealer Agreement. Any change may be set out in a Pricing Supplement or in another supplement to this Information Memorandum.

Taxation

Australian Taxation

The following is a summary of certain Australian withholding tax consequences under the Income Tax Assessment Acts 1936 and 1997 of Australia (together, the “**Australian Tax Act**”), at the date of this Information Memorandum, of an investment in the Notes to be issued by the Issuer under the Programme and certain other Australian tax matters. It is a general guide and should be treated with appropriate caution. The summary is not exhaustive and, in particular, it does not deal with the position of certain classes of holders of Notes (including, without limitation, dealers in securities, custodians or other third parties who hold Notes on behalf of other persons). In addition, unless expressly stated, this summary does not consider the Australian tax consequences for persons who hold interests in the Notes through Austraclear, Euroclear, Clearstream, Luxembourg or another clearing system. Prospective holders of Notes should also be aware that particular terms of issue of any Series of Notes may affect the tax treatment of that Series of Notes. Information regarding taxes in respect of Notes may also be set out in the relevant Pricing Supplement

This summary is not intended to be, nor should it be construed as, legal or tax advice to any particular holder of the Notes. Prospective holders of Notes who are in any doubt as to their tax position should consult their professional advisers on the tax implications of an investment in the Notes for their particular circumstances.

1 Australian interest withholding tax

So long as the Issuer continues to be a non-resident of Australia and the Notes issued by it are not attributable to a permanent establishment of the Issuer in Australia, payments of principal and interest made under Notes issued by the Issuer should not be subject to Australian interest withholding tax imposed under Division 11A of Part III of the Australian Tax Act.

2 Other Australian tax matters

Under Australian laws as presently in effect:

- (a) *stamp duty and other taxes* – no *ad valorem* stamp, issue, registration or similar taxes are payable in any Australian State or Territory on the issue or transfer of any Notes;
- (b) *other withholding taxes on payments in respect of Notes* – so long as the Issuer continues to be a non-resident of Australia and the Notes are not issued at or through a permanent establishment of the Issuer in Australia, the tax file number requirements of Part VA of the Australian Tax Act and section 12-140 of Schedule 1 to the Taxation Administration Act 1953 of Australia (“**Taxation Administration Act**”) should not apply to the Issuer;
- (c) *supply withholding tax* – payments in respect of the Notes can be made free and clear of the “supply withholding tax” imposed under section 12-190 of Schedule 1 to the Taxation Administration Act; and
- (d) *goods and services tax (“GST”)* – neither the issue nor receipt of the Notes will give rise to a liability for GST in Australia on the basis that the supply of Notes will comprise either an input taxed financial supply, a GST-free supply or a supply which is outside the scope of the GST law. Furthermore, neither the payment of principal or interest by the Issuer, nor the disposal of the Notes, would give rise to any GST liability in Australia.

Finnish Taxation

The following is a general summary of the Issuer's understanding of current law and practice in Finland. They relate only to the position of persons who are the absolute beneficial owners of the Notes. The summary herein is not exhaustive and does not address all potential aspects of Finnish taxation that may be relevant for a potential investor in the Notes. They may not apply to certain classes of person such as dealers or Noteholders who are subject to special tax rules, such as, among others, general or limited partnerships. It does not purport to be a complete summary of Finnish tax law and practice currently applicable and does not constitute legal or tax advice. All prospective investors in the Notes are advised to consult their own tax advisers with respect to the tax consequences under the tax laws of the country in which they are resident, of the purchase, ownership or disposition of the Notes or any interest therein. It should be noted that the tax laws of Finland may be amended with retroactive effect.

1 General

The scope of taxation in Finland is defined by the tax liability position of a taxpayer. Finnish residents for taxation purposes are subject to taxation in Finland on their worldwide income. Persons that are not resident in Finland for taxation purposes and are not deemed to have a permanent establishment in Finland for Finnish tax purposes are subject to taxation in Finland solely in respect of their Finnish source income.

Generally, an individual is deemed to be a Finnish resident for taxation purposes if the individual continuously stays in Finland for more than six consecutive months or if the permanent home and abode of the individual is in Finland. A citizen of Finland who has moved abroad is regarded as resident for Finnish taxation purposes until three years have passed after the end of the year of emigration, even if the individual would not stay in Finland for six consecutive months and the permanent home and abode would not be located in Finland, if the individual cannot prove that they have not had any essential ties to Finland in the tax year in question.

Legal entities established under the laws of Finland are regarded as residents of Finland in accordance with domestic tax law. In addition, as of 2021, foreign entities with their place of effective management in Finland can be deemed as Finnish tax resident corporations.

2 Taxation of Notes

Under present Finnish domestic tax law, payments in respect of the Notes will be exempt from all taxes, duties and fees of whatever nature, imposed or levied by or within the Republic of Finland or by any municipality or other political subdivision or taxing authority thereof or therein, except such taxation the Noteholder to which any such payment relates is subject to thereon by reason of such Noteholder being connected with the Republic of Finland otherwise than solely by the holding of such Note or the receipt of income therefrom. The recipient is obliged to disclose his or her non-resident investor status to the payer. If a recipient fails to provide such information, the Issuer will be entitled to withhold or deduct amounts from a payment in respect of the Notes, if it is required to do so under Finnish law and the Issuer will not be required to pay the recipient any additional amounts.

3 Finnish Capital Gains Taxes

Holders of Notes who are not resident in Finland for tax purposes and who do not engage in trade or business through a permanent establishment or a fixed place of business in Finland will not be subject to Finnish duties or taxes on gains realised on the sale or redemption of the Notes.

FATCA Withholding

Pursuant to certain provisions of U.S. law, commonly known as FATCA, a “**foreign financial institution**” may be required to withhold on certain payments it makes (foreign passthru payments) to persons that fail to meet certain certification, reporting, or related requirements. The Issuer is a foreign financial institution for these purposes. A number of jurisdictions (including Finland) have entered into, or have agreed in substance to, intergovernmental agreements with the United States to implement FATCA (“**IGAs**”), which modify the way in which FATCA applies in their jurisdictions. Under the provisions of IGAs as currently in effect, a foreign financial institution in an IGA jurisdiction would generally not be required to withhold under FATCA or an IGA from payments that it makes. Certain aspects of the application of these rules to instruments such as the Notes, including whether withholding would ever be required pursuant to FATCA or an IGA with respect to payments on instruments such as the Notes, are uncertain and may be subject to change. Even if withholding would be required pursuant to FATCA or an IGA with respect to payments on instruments such as the Notes, such withholding would not apply prior to the date that is two years after the publication of the final regulations defining “foreign passthru payment” and, Notes characterised as debt (or which are not otherwise characterised as equity and have a fixed term) for U.S. federal tax purposes, that are issued on or prior to the date that is six months after the date on which final regulations defining “foreign passthru payments” are filed with the U.S. Federal Register generally would be “grandfathered” for purposes of FATCA withholding unless materially modified after such date. However, if additional Notes (as described under Condition 18 (“Further issues”)) that are not distinguishable from grandfathered Notes are issued after the expiration of the grandfather period and are subject to withholding under FATCA, then withholding agents may treat all Notes in the Series, including grandfathered Notes, as subject to withholding under FATCA. Noteholders should consult their own tax advisor(s) regarding how these rules may apply to their investment in the Notes. In the event any withholding would be required pursuant to FATCA or an IGA with respect to payments on the Notes, no person will be required to pay additional amounts as a result of the withholding.

The proposed financial transactions tax (“FTT”)

On 14 February 2013, the European Commission published a proposal (the “**Commission’s Proposal**”) for a Directive for a common FTT in Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia and Slovakia (the “**participating Member States**”). However, Estonia has since stated that it will not participate.

The Commission’s Proposal has very broad scope and could, if introduced, apply to certain dealings in the Notes (including secondary market transactions) in certain circumstances.

Under the Commission’s Proposal, the FTT could apply in certain circumstances to persons both within and outside of the participating Member States. Generally, it would apply to certain dealings in the Notes where at least one party is a financial institution, and at least one party is established in a participating Member State. A financial institution may be, or be deemed to be, “established” in a participating Member State in a broad range of circumstances, including (a) by transacting with a person established in a participating Member State or (b) where the financial instrument which is subject to the dealings is issued in a participating Member State.

However, the FTT proposal remains subject to negotiation between participating Member States. It may therefore be altered prior to any implementation, the timing of which remains unclear. Additional EU Member States may decide to participate.

Prospective holders of the Notes are advised to seek their own professional advice in relation to the FTT.

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
